Sixth Sunday of Easter

St. Mary & St. John Station Road As Jesus prepared to leave the world he promised to give the Holy Spirit to his disciples. We are his disciples and receive his Spirit but only if we love him and keep his commandments.

#### Do we make others aware of God's love by our words and our actions?

The recent visit to our parish of Comboni Missionaries, Fathers Denis & Pat Wilkinson, brings to mind a story involving another Comboni Missionary. Ethiopia is a land of hardship, with famine, droughts and wars increasing the suffering of the people. For the love of these people, Bishop Gasparini, an Italian Comboni missionary, made Awasa, in Southern Ethiopia his home. He and his small band of Comboni missionaries showed the love of God through their tireless work in training Lay-Catechists, establishing medical clinics in rural areas and providing schools. From having one parish in the early 1960s, the church in Awasa has grown to 17 parishes, with nearly 400 out-stations. There are now hundreds of Catechists and the Catholic population has increased over a thousand fold. Every day over a thousand people are treated in the clinics, and 11,000 children are receiving an education, who would not otherwise have done so. Bishop Gasparini retired in 1993 and explained how he can see the difference that Christ has made in the lives of the people.

We cannot all be missionaries in distant countries but we can help. The people here in Ballincollig have always responded generously. Do we however realize that we can take the love of Christ to the people around us? It has never been easy to Evangelise. In past times persecution has been the response to many who have gone before us. When the Deacon Philip first went to a Samaritan town he was by no means assured of a warm welcome. This was shortly after Stephen, another deacon, had been stoned to death and Saul of Tarsus had begun his persecution of Christians.

In today's reading, Peter's First Letter, we are advised to be prepared to explain what our faith is about and why we continue to be people of hope. But whatever words we use, it is in the way we lead our lives that we are judged. As Bishop Gasparini observed, "It is Christ through the Holy Spirit who makes a difference in our lives and in those of the people who accept Him with joyful hearts."

As Christians we have received the Holy Spirit – a power that is not of our own making. But the Spirit needs our co-operation too. We need to know about our faith in order to share it with others. Talking about it with our friends and family can help us put our thoughts into words. Let us remember that it is in the way we conduct ourselves and in what we do that the message is most effectively conveyed. It is never too late to begin,why not today?

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

#### Saint Conleth 04-May-2005

First bishop of Kildare, was originally a native of Oirthear Life, the eastern plain of the Liffey. He was probably born about the middle of the fifth century and ostensibly belonged to one of the ancient families engaged in the craft of metalworking. Conleth obviously felt, however, that his vocation lay elsewhere, so abandoning all vestiges of his former life; he began his religious career as an anchorite near the ancient assembly place of Connell. Although this embryonic community soon began to flourish under the guiding hand of Conleth, he was not destined to remain in its patronage. St. Brigid's convent on the outskirts of the Curragh had expanded at a phenomenal rate since its inception, and desperately required the presence of a bishop to minister and perform pastoral duties to the ever increasing community. Saint Conleth (first bishop of Kildare) was consecrated circa 490 and joined the flock of St. Brigid shortly thereafter. After a fruitful and lengthy association with Brigid, Conleth decided to make the pilgrimage to Rome, however during the journey he was accosted by a ravenous pack of wolves and slaughtered. Conleth's remains were subsequently enshrined in the Cathedral of Kildare in 799, thirty six years before the Viking invasion, and it is precisely this Nordic conquest which caused Conleth's remains to be returned to Connell. It is unknown whether they were moved due to fore knowledge of the imminent attack, or simply reinterred after they had been discarded by treasure hungry Vikings. What is certain, however, is that Conleth was buried at the site of his vocational conception which remained as a testament to his piety, humility, and indomitable faith
