A Mother's Love

"Does a woman fail to cherish the child of her womb? Yet even if these forget, I will never forget you." Many years ago (15 yrs. approx.) I witnessed the depth of a mother's love for her child. A few hours earlier her son of sixteen, named Jamie, had driven a stolen car at high speed through a densely populated area, the car was written off, his companion escaped unharmed from the wreckage, damaged lamp posts and railings remained as evidence of this debacle and Jamie lay on a hospital bed with multiple injuries and organ damage, thankfully those walking about escaped from injuries.

Jennifer visited her son in hospital, shocked by his activity late at night and so ashamed hoping she would not be noticed. The medical report of Jamie's injuries was long and detailed. Jennifer's heartbreak, the tone of her voice as well as her tears gave a clear indication of her love and affection for Jamie. She needed some encouragement to put words on her love for Jamie. Eventually she stooped and whispered in his ear " Jamie I love you " as the tears flowed down his cheek she was so relieved that she plucked up the courage to utter those precious words.

Isaiah 40 conveyed a message of constant love and affection for Zion and the people of Jerusalem in their time of desolation. That constant love and affection is whispered to each of us every moment of our lives. Help me to be open to this message of love.

Worry is part of being human, when I am almost overwhelmed by worry, Lord help me to believe that your constant love and affection is with me. Lord you hold me in the palm of your hand, may your touch be my strength.

The season of Lent 2014 is in the door, generally Ash Wednesday is marked by many of us receiving ashes signifying my intention to turn to the Lord and give Him an even more central role in my life. Lent is a call to commitment to prayer, to the less well off in our world (Trocaire) and refocusing my daily living on my Saviour God. Hopefully we will be able to commit to the great prayer the Mass on a daily basis throughout Lent.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 49:14-15

One of the desert fathers is reported as saying that 'Forgetfulness is the root of all evil'. This sounds a bit extreme. Surely to forget someone's birthday or anniversary is not so serious. Memory lapses are understandable in busy lives, especially as we grow older. This reading shows how serious forgetfulness is in linking it with the notion of abandonment. To forget may be to abandon someone. God has perfect memory. He never abandons his creation.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 4:1-5

The 'iceberg theory' of morality warns against reducing morality to external acts and urges us to explore the human heart. This reading stresses the role of the 'secret intentions of men's hearts' in moral judgement. We may fool other people by hiding our real motives for acting, but God's searchlight judgment is infallible. May this light illumine our fallible consciences.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 6:24-34

This text is surely related to the beatitude of the pure of heart, which is concerned with single-mindedness, putting God first and resistance to idolatry. Anthony Bloom once used the image of Gulliver in the land of Lilliput to illustrate this point. Having being washed ashore unconscious, Gulliver awakes, but can't get up because the little folk have tied him down by each of his strands of long hair. The cumulative effect of the worries mentioned in the gospel, immobilise us and prevent us from achieving the liberation associated with God's Kingdom and belief in his providential care. Every desire of the heart must be subordinated to firm belief that in God alone 'all shall be well'.

Cork Simon Community

Works in solidarity with men and women who are homeless, offering housing and support in their journey back to independent or supported living. In 2013, over 1,000 people turned to Cork Simon Community for support. Cork Simon relies on hundreds of volunteers to undertake its work and to help to fundraise over 2 million euro each year to maintain its services. Cork Simon is seeking volunteers for its Annual Bag Pack Fundraising Drive taking place in Cork and Kerry on April 4th, 5th and 6th. If you would like to get involved by giving up two hours of your time to bag pack in your local Tesco or Dunnes please contact kerry on 021 4929410. Volunteering in your local community is an opportunity to make a meaningful contribution to supporting the work of Cork Simon and supporting people in finding a pathway out of homelessness. Among Cork Simon's most well know services are the Emergency Shelter and the Soup Run. Cork Simon's Emergency Shelters has 48 beds and is full every night of the year while the Soup Run operates every night of the year, offering nourishing food and a listening ear and is often the first point of contact for people who become homeless in Cork. Cork Simon Community also provides housing at five high-support houses throughout the city for people with health needs that require 24 hour care and 27 flats throughout the city for people who are leaving homelessness behind them. In addition to accommodation, Cork Simon offers support to people to maintain their tenancies', access to health services, training and employment opportunities and a range of personal supports to enable people to move out of homelessness.
