The Resurrection

Easter being springtime is a season of hope and expectation in its own right. But in particular for Christians, Easter is the time when we celebrate the Lord's resurrection and new life. Easter is a time of joy and hope for us because through his resurrection Jesus took the past of the apostles, as he does ours, forgave the worst of it and saved the best of it. He conquered the future by making death a door to be opened instead of a dead end. Most happily of all, he gave each of us His Presence - His Spirit - to be the way through which we live toward. That future which, "eye has not seen nor ear heard".

Easter is also an opportunity for us to revisit the Gospel, accounts of the empty tomb discovered by the two Marys, Peter and John when the risen Christ said. "Do not be afraid, but go and find the brothers, and tell them I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God". The Lord depends on each of us to experience His Resurrection and to tell the story.

This year as usual on Holy Thursday the Holy Father issued a letter to priests worldwide. The Pope wrote, "Priests must walk the walk and talk the talk if they are to live up to their vocation. Thanksgiving, self-sacrifice, a desire to show others the way to salvation, remembering Christ's saving work, holiness and hope must mark not only a priest's celebration of Mass but his whole life as well." The Pope goes on to say that priests "must cultivate a constant sense of gratitude for the many gifts they have received in the course of their life. We have our crosses to bear, and we are certainly not the only ones, but the gifts we have received are so great that we cannot fail to sing from the depths of our hearts, our own Magnificat".

Modelling his life on Christ who gave Himself for others, the Pope said a priest must, "offer himself as a gift, placing himself at the disposal of the community and at the service of anyone in need." This is exactly what Jesus expected of his apostles. Priests are called to be heralds of the Good News. On the Cross and through the Eucharist, Jesus shed his blood for the salvation of all the people.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

Early Christians adhered to apostolic teaching, centering their lives on prayer, the breaking of the bread, the common life, and charity.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

Through God's great mercy, Christians have new life in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The goal of faith is salvation.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Following Jesus' crucifixion the disciples were still uncertain of his message. They lost hope and in fear locked themselves in a room. Without entering through the door, Jesus appeared before them with a greeting of peace and a mission to spread the Good News. The disciple, Thomas, was not in the room. When he learned of Jesus' visit, he would not believe it. But about week later, Jesus appeared in a similar way when Thomas was with the others. Jesus invited Thomas to touch the wounds in his hands and side. Thomas knew immediately that it was Jesus and believed in him.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Isidore 08-April-2005

His family came from Cartagena on the Mediterranean coast of Spain, but Isidore himself was born in 560 in Seville, and was later to be archbishop of that city. His brother Leander, a monk, was responsible for his education; Isidore's vast erudition spilled over into his books, which were of great influence in medieval clerical and monastic schools. He was archbishop of Seville for 36 years, giving the Spanish church a greater organisation and cohesion and weaning the Visigothic people back from the Arian heresy (which denied the divinity of Christ). Under his inspiration, it was decided that each diocese should establish a cathedral school to promote public education. A noted liturgist, Isidore finalised the texts of the Mozarabic Rite (the Rite of the Catholic Church used in those parts of Spain under Moorish rule – the Rite still exists today, though now confined to the city of Toledo and its environs). Isidore's books are not all obviously theological, and serve to remind us that a 'church' education was a general education: the church inspired the universities, for example. One of his best known works is the Etymologies, an encyclopaedia including the derivations of words on a host of different topics. Admittedly some of these derivations have since been shown to be wrong. Isidore died in 636, but ecclesiastical recognition does not always come quickly. He was canonised only in 1598 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1722.
