TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Many people think of God as remote and invisible. Our extraordinary faith tells us, that he is also so close to us, that we can hear his Word, and know what he wants from us. Today we are called not just to hear his Word, but to practice it without hypocrisy, so that we may receive life.

PAUL AND WOMEN'S RIGHTS

In the second reading at last Sunday's Mass, St. Paul stated that the husband is head of his wife and that wives should submit to their husbands in everything. In the light of today's thinking on the equality of women this statement makes extraordinary reading indeed and must give offence to many women. St. Paul lived and wrote in the Middle Eastern world where to this day the treatment of women is appalling. Systems such as purdah forbid women from showing their faces in public while the acceptance of polygamy degrades the status of women. The Jewish people, at least, were more advanced than that but still St. Paul was a child of his era and in accepting much of the received thinking showed a lack of originality. But then we all tend to accept the fashions of our time without question whether it be in hair style, dress social attitudes or even, at times, morality.

In the year 2000 we are all sensitive to human rights especially those of women. Yet not so long ago, we saw nothing wrong in a system of remuneration which paid women less than men even if both their employment and qualifications were identical. Up to the 1970's a lady Secondary teacher, for example, received less than her male counterpart. Many women were obliged to resign their positions on marriage. No politician, no journalist, no trades union leader, no priest complained about this injustice.

It is easy to be wise in hindsight. It is not so easy to take a cold look at the defects in the thinking of our own era. Today's world is full of examples. It is accepted that on televised current affairs discussions the panel will feature three men and one woman. No one objects when the men's All Ireland football final is a national event while the women's passes almost unheeded by public and media alike. In spite of lipservice to gender balance men still dominate in key positions such as newspaper editorships, top positions in hospital, the legal world and the business world. The Church is frequently and justifiably criticised for its attitude to women. But other institutions are equally guilty and deserves equal

Just as we learn so much wisdom from the writings of St. Paul we should also learn from his mistakes and never accept without criticism the fashionable attitudes of our own time.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

Monday 4th - St. Oengus MacNissi took his name from his mother, Cnes or Ness. It is claimed that Patrick baptised him and taught him the Psalms. He chose the district of Connor for his hermitage, but later became bishop of his clan. He died early in the sixth century.

Saturday 9th - St. Ciaran was born in Roscommon, probably in 512. He was baptised and fostered by the deacon Diarmuid. He went to Clonard in 529. He also spent periods with Ninnid, Enda and Senan, and founded Inis Aingin on Lough Ree. In January 545 he came to Clonmacnois where he founded a monastery which was to become one of the most renowned in Europe. He died at the age of 33 while the monastery was being built.

On Monday the Team Acrobatics Finals were held and the Ballincollig Team of Michelle and David Sheehan, Denis Moloney, Kieran Buckley and Ann Marie O'Connell defeated the Wexford team, by 0.03 to take the gold.

Also on Monday the Ballincollig Girls Pitch & Putt Team, of Elaine Murphy, Karen O'Brien, Sarah McSweeney and Brid Foley, were in outstanding form


