The Gospel of Luke

The Gospels were written in a place and time other than our own, we will sometimes need help to understand the story they tell. The Gospels give us an account of the life of Jesus and in doing this they speak of the people of their time and also it's culture. The gospels relate stories concerning centurions, Samaritans, Sadducees and Magi, - people that we are very unfamiliar with. We also hear of tax- collectors and lawyers, who are still with us, but in biblical times these professions evoked different associations. Tax collectors were seen as traitors as they worked on behalf of the conquering power, The lawyers job was to interpret the scriptures, a little different to the work of lawyers in our culture. Information about the customs of the time and its history can also be of assistance. During his presentation on Tuesday January 30th, Fr Sean 0' Sullivan addressed a number of areas to help us appreciate and understand Luke's gospel.

Who is Luke? There is a long standing church tradition that attributes this gospel to "Luke the physician" a companion of Paul mentioned a number of times in Paul's letters. However some scholars question this as the writer seems to have little knowledge of Paul's letters. He tells us himself that he was not an eyewitness to Jesus' ministry, but has received the tradition handed down carefully to him. He is fluent in Greek and is very familiar with the Old Testament. The gospel is dated sometime around 85 about fifty years after Christ.

Who is this gospel written for? The gospel is written for believers, 'so that they may know the truth about the things in which they have been instructed.' The church at this time was quickly becoming more Greek than Jewish in composition. The early Christian communities had suffered under Nero, Christianity continued to be illegal. The readers were speaking Greek rather than Aramaic and they were also urban dwellers rather than the poor peasants in the days of Christ. (To be continued).
