Pentecost, Birthday of the Church

Pentecost saw the birth of a new community, the new people of God. Today then is the birthday of the Church. This is the day the Apostles left the upper room, where they had been hiding for fear of the Jews, and went out fearlessly to preach the Gospel. They could not have done this without "power from on high", that is the Holy Spirit.

Now there was a group of men who came together, very ordinary men who had little faith in their own abilities. They were to build, as it were, a spiritual stairway to Heaven. It was not only they who conceived the idea, but their Master. Before His death, He told them not to begin until He sent them "power from on high".

On Pentecost Day, the Spirit descended on these men, the Apostles and they set forth to build a new community, the community of the new people of God. They spoke a new language, it was the language of love and co-operation, a language all people of Goodwill understood. For love transcends speech. It shines in the face and is felt in the clasp of a hand. Hence it can unite people of different languages.

Today is the birthday of this great happening. It is the birthday of the Church, the community of the flowers of Jesus. On this day the infant church left the cradle and took its first steps, not faltering, but boldly, thanks to the power of the Holy Spirit. God knows down the ages it has been seen its fair share of troubles, problems and setbacks. But it is still being built today.

It is assembled here in front of our eyes today, and it is something marvellous. Not that it is made up of saints. It is rather like the field Jesus spoke about -a mixture of wheat and weeds. When we are gathered here in church we do so as friends. Here those factors that have traditionally divided people, such as class, colour, age, wealth and so on, count for nothing. There is a great levelling off. We realize that before God we are all equal.

The things that divide us are trivial, the things we have in common are tremendous. Deep down we all have the same needs – to be valued and to belong – members of God's people on pilgrimage to the Kingdom of Heaven.

This is the wonderful thing that began on Pentecost. We too are builders of this spiritual stairway. Let us pray for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in all our lives especially at this time.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 2: 1-11

You will notice the phrases "what sounded like a powerful wind", "something that seemed like tongues of fire". This is not an exact visual description of the Holy Spirit. John is speaking in symbols. Fire symbolised the power and the presence of God. The wind is a symbol of the Holy Spirit who would soon disperse the little group to the four corners of the world. Writing of the miracle of Pentecost, when the Apostles spoke in many languages, the early Christian writers drew the parallel between the tower of Babel when God confused languages to punish mankind for their pride and Pentecost when the Spirit of God brought all to unity again.

Second Reading: Galatians 5: 16-25

The old Law of the Bible was mainly negative. Do not do this or that. Christian liberty is positive. It encourages us to go way beyond the Law and sets no limits to the good we can do in our lives. If we follow the Spirit and follow His promptings we will achieve complete victory over ourselves.

Gospel: John 15: 26-27; 16:12-15

The Holy Spirit is a real person distinct from the Father and the Son. Towards the world he is an accuser from whom there is no escape. Towards the Apostles he is Christ's great substitute to guide them into all religious truth. Bitter critics of the Church should remember that they are attacking a Church that will have as its guide the Holy Spirit for ever.

Preparation for Baptism

Baptism is our first step on the journey of Faith, the sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith and the Life of Christ. It is also a sacrament of welcome into the Christian community. The importance of preparation for Baptism was highlighted at the Parish Council and also by some parents requesting help for themselves. For the past number of months a group of parishioners have come together to provide some resources and help for parents bringing their children to Baptism. On Saturday 10th June our next meeting for parents who wish to have their children baptised in the parish of Ballincollig will take place. This is an opportunity to prepare for the sacrament of Baptism. I am confident that this presentation will be of benefit to parents and godparents in their role as Christian educators.
