This week's gospel passage is the wonderful passage that tells the story of the meeting of Jesus and Zacchaeus. The Irish Heart Foundation Alcohol & My Heart

Alcohol can be enjoyable and beneficial for your heart. In those who consume moderate amounts of alcohol (an average of one to two drinks per day for men and one drink per day for women) the incidence of heart disease is lower than in non-drinkers. (These benefits are not just limited to red wine). However, when used in excess, it can cause strokes, high blood pressure, cirrhosis of the liver and may be directly toxic to the heart muscle producing heart rhythm disturbances and heart failure. It can also raise the levels of some blood fats to produce hypertriglyceridaemia. With excess alcohol intake and severe hypertriglyceridaemia, pancreatitis may occur. Unfortunately, alcohol is also high in calories and so may contribute to excess weight and its associated cardiovascular problems. Binge drinking can cause severe hypertension and precipitate a stroke.

Alcohol can increase the level of the "good or healthy cholesterol" i.e High Density Lipoprotein cholesterol "HDL" cholesterol. Some alcoholic drinks also contain flavanoids which are thought to have a protective effect on the heart.

One should drink in moderation. The Irish Heart Foundation does not recommend alcohol consumption as part of heart health, but advises in those who drink that men should consume less than 21 units of alcohol per week whereas women should consume no more than 14 units of alcohol per week. However, if you have an alcohol related medical condition such as high blood pressure or heart failure you should consider much lower alcohol limits such as less than 10 units per week. In some instances as stated below alcohol should be avoided.
