Nurturing our Children's Faith

As priests and bishops we have the privilege of being present at some of the most important moments in the lives of families. We are very grateful that we are welcomed to be part of such occasions, not only in churches and schools, but also in homes. We are happy to be present at joyful times for our young people, such as Baptisms, First Holy Communions and Confirmations. We are also present and available at times of pain, when a family is visited by sickness, or is distraught with grief because of death and bereavement. Whether the occasion is joyful or sorrowful, we can certainly say that faith makes a great difference.

Our experience tells us that the faith of children is best nurtured when home, school and parish work together in partnership. Firstly and most importantly, children learn about faith in the home. Their faith is supported in the school by the hard work of teachers and chaplains, and by both priests and people in the wider parish community.

As Christians, our hope is rooted in Christ. Hope in the person of Christ is nurtured in his constant presence with us in the sacrament of the Eucharist. He is the centre. We gather around Him, especially in the celebration of the Eucharist liturgy when we gather around the altar to welcome Him and to receive Him. As Pope John Paul 11 said, the Eucharist 'is the most precious possession which the Church can have in her journey through history' (Eclesia de Eucharistia 9). The Mass gives us strength to develop a loving, sensitive, forgiving and nurturing home environment.

Reflection for Parents

The gospel today is especially helpful for parents. Many (maybe most) nights we fall into bed exhausted from a day of responsibilities. Perhaps it was our intention throughout the day to find time to pray, but sometimes we just don't get to it. At the end of the day, we resolve to talk with God, but wake in the morning to find out we fell asleep before we finished the prayer. Jesus gives us the example that we must take the time away from the busyness and demands of our lives to be fortified and strengthened to meet the most important responsibilities we have and that is the spiritual formation of our children and our family.

Ballincollig Students take on the Music Business Coca-Cola blast:beat

Transition Year Students from Ballincollig Community School in Cork are taking part in the national music business competition, Coca-Cola Blast-beat, which involves them running their own Mini Music Company and "Battle of the Bands" competition. Coca-Cola Blast-Beat is recognised by the Department of Education as being committed to the overall aims and philosophy of the Transition Year Programme.

The Ballincollig students will be competing with 23 other schools from around the country for the grand prize of ε 5,000. Each Mini Music Company will stage their own concert as part of a National Battle of the Bands Competition with the overall winning band receiving the grand prize of a **RECORD DEAL** with Kidnapped Records.

The objective of the Coca-Cola Blast-beat Transition Year Project is to empower students to set up their own Multimedia Music Companies to find, promote and market young bands and artists in their schools and local community. Coca-Cola Blast-Beat requires students to be self-motivated, making many crucial business decisions during the project which at the same time having fun learning the skills required to be successful young entrepreneurs. All the participants will work in teams with their fellow students and there will always be a support network available to them through their schools and the Coca-Cola Blast-Beat management team.

The students from Ballincollig Community School are now busy setting up the Coca-Cola Blast-Beat Vol 3 CD. This CD, containing 10 of the best up and coming young Irish artists, is on sale at **Roxy Records**, **Ballincollig**, all Blast concerts and in Synthetic Records These students are also organising a concert which will feature a host of fresh and exciting unsigned talent. This goes ahead on 12th February in the Half Moon Theatre.

The final for the competition will take place in **THE HELIX** on 13th May when each Mini Music Company will present their work for the year and the national Battle of the Bands final will take place. **RTE** will be following the progress of the competition with a **6 Part TV Series** set to his our screens in spring.

First Reading: Job 7: 1-4. 6-7

The Book of Job takes us to the depth of human suffering – even to the depths of despair.

Second Reading: 1 Cor. 9: 16-19, 22-23

St. Paul tells of his enthusiasm for preaching the gospel.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

We learn several important pieces of information from this gospel passage. First, Simon Peter had a mother-in-law. When we read previously that he left his fishing boat to follow Jesus, we can safely assume that he left much more than that. He had a family at home and we hear in this gospel of Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law. Also, this gospel helps us recognise the need Jesus had to be away from the crowds and confusion to take time to pray and become revitalised and strengthened for his ministry.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Gobnait is one of the best loved saints in West Cork but only traditions concerning her life survive. The main part of her life was spent in Ballyvourney, Co Cork, where there has always been a deep devotion to her, and which is a place of pilgrimage on February 11th and on Pentecost. Her gifts of caring for and curing the sick have been a significant part of her cult through the centuries. Happily her memorial coincides with the World Day for the Sick.

Lourdes Pilgrimage Invalid Fund Next Weekend 11th & 12th February 2006

World Day of the Sick 11th February, 2006

World Day of the Sick will be held on Saturday 11th February, 2006, which is also the Feast Day of Our Lady of Lourdes. Pope John Paul hoped that this day would be an "intense moment of prayer and a call for everyone to recognise in the face of our sick brothers and sisters, the Holy Face of Christ, who, in suffering, died and rising again, carried out the salvation of humanity".

The Holy Father's message for this year focuses on "Mental Health and Human Dignity" – the theme of the 2006 World Day of the Sick. Pope Benedict XV1, in his message for this day, wishes special attention to be given to those with mental illness and said that they "should not be seen as a burden for their families and community. They should be given access to necessary forms of care and treatment".

This weekend, Saturday 4th February and Sunday 5th February might be an appropriate time to encourage people to visit the sick, especially those in long term care in hospitals and nursing homes.


