Discovering Lent

Traditionally a time for fasting and self-denial, Lent can be viewed in a rather negative way, and with less enthusiasm than other times of the Christian year. From early childhood it becomes associated with "giving things up" and a strengthening of will power. Whilst these can be good and necessary things, Lent should not be a negative experience, as today's Scripture shows us. Lent is a voyage of discovery, or rediscovery, of our real relationship with God.

When we read Jesus' words, our attention cannot help but be drawn to those things that we should do - the fasting, the almsgiving and so on. Lent is certainly a time to take stock of our attitudes to these things. However, Jesus is not calling us just to get our lives in order, but to rekindle our personal prayer life. Several times he tells us to withdraw to a private place, where we can be alone to pray to our Heavenly Father who sees all. Indeed, in the middle of this Gospel passage Matthew places the perfect prayer, the "Our Father". The fasting and self-denial only have relevance in the context of a prayerful relationship with our loving Father. In other words, it's not about doing things to make us feel good, or to feel a sense of achievement, but rather to make the ordering of our lives flow naturally from God's love for us, and our love for him.

Perhaps, at times, it can seem rather more daunting to isolate ourselves to pray than it is to do good works. Prayer can seem intimidating, and it can be difficult to know where to start. The great spiritual classic 'The Cloud of Unknowing' wisely says that "God wants us to pray, and will tell us how to begin where we are." God meets us in the weakness, the vulnerability and the inadequacy, which may characterise our present state. God meets us in the present moment, wherever we are. Let us resolve this Lent to set aside some time – even a modest amount of time at first – for personal prayer, in order to rediscover our need for God's love in our lives.

TROCAIRE

This Lent Trocaire is focusing on the plight of child labourers and especially on the children working in appalling conditions on the plantations of Nicaragua. Many of these children work long hours, all day every day in terrible conditions and do not get the opportunity to go to school.

Many children throughout our world are doing hazardous work in harmful conditions, putting their health, education and even their lives at risk. Sometimes work is a vital source of income that helps to sustain children and their families, but when a child is forced into exploitative labour then his or her entire childhood is destroyed. Throughout the world over 180 million children work in hazardous conditions. Many of these working children work very long hours for very little or in some cases no pay without any choice as they need to help support their families.

In this weeks gospel a promise is made between God and every living creature. God promises to look after our world and everything in it, so long as in return we all look after each other and protect the world for future generations. Pope Benedict XVI in his Lenten message reminds us that no economic, social or political project can replace that gift of self to another through which charity is expressed. This lent we should take into consideration the Gospel message and the Pope's Lenten message and help Trocaire give these children a second chance through education.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Genesis 9: 8-15

God made covenants or agreements with men on three occasions in the Old Testament: with Noah, Abraham and Moses. These covenants implied that man agreed of his own free will to serve God. In return God would forgive and take care of mankind. The rainbow was aptly chosen as the sign of the covenant as rain from heaven had been one of the causes of the flood.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3: 18 - 22

Noah and his family were saved not only from water but by water, i.e. the water carried the ark aloft. In the same way the water of baptism saves us. The flood was a type of baptism that purified mankind.

Gospel: Mark 1: 12 - 15

Mark gives only a summary account of the temptation of Christ. Satan wished to discover whether Jesus was the Messiah and, if possible, to lead him from the path of suffering, which God had ordained as the course to be followed by the Redeemer. Mark alone mentions the wild beasts whose presence suggests the desolate character of the region to which the Lord had retired. John the Baptist was now in prison and Jesus went into Galilee where John had preached and began by repeating the call to repentance.
