Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

We are all a bit like Thomas: unless we see we find it difficult to believe. However, faith is a way of seeing, seeing beyond the apparent problems of life to the hope given by the Resurrection of Jesus, the hope of sharing heaven with Him.

WE FEEL HURT TOO

For a time I thought the issue of Church abuse had quietened down, and I had contented myself to thinking the whole thing was being dealt with by the apologies and the compensation, and getting on with the job I've offered my life to doing, that of spreading and living the Gospel of Christ in the world as I know it. Gone were the days of the Brendan Smith's et al. Or so I thought. Watching the documentary "Sinners" it raised its ugly head again. I watched the programme in horror, shame and extreme sadness when we got a glimpse of the Ireland of the '30s to the late '60s. How people were treated by religious and others then is beyond me and my wildest imagination. Being shown on a Saturday night, I wondered would there be any one at Mass the following day. People tell me that things are bad today. They tell me that there is no respect for anyone any more. "Society has changed from bad to worse" they tell me. I really do wonder. To me Ireland today is a different place to what it was ten or twenty years ago. Some still hold on to some of the mistaken values of the past, giving honour to where it is not deserved. Personally it annoys me when some of the older men doff their caps when they meet me, however that is the way they were taught. I find that to some if you are not the "Parish Priest" or of higher authority you are nothing. I hold that Ireland and society in general despite all its difficulties is still a better place to live in. I have a tremendous respect for all those people who attend Mass and religious services regularly to strengthen their Christian faith. Despite all I feel that there is still a yearning for the spiritual among young and old. Going back to the abuse issues, "Sinners" was highly dramatised but from what I was told wasn't too far from the truth. A friend of mine who experienced the Magdelenes told me that she never saw physical abuse given by the Nuns. I greeted the resignation of Bishop Brendan Comiskey with sadness as I felt that the man has a lot to offer as a human leader. True his handling of the abuse issues seems to have been poor, time will be the arbitrator of that. The pain of the victims of both physical and sexual abuse by priests, nuns and anyone else can never be underestimated. That pain is beyond the comprehension of any of us. All abuse in this sense is wrong. Investigations I hope will follow. On Easter Monday I got some nasty anonymous telephone calls that were not too pleasant and their contents I found very hurtful.

In all the talk and print I have come across over the years, I have never heard anyone mention the causes of these abuses and how it could be dealt with. In my estimation there has to be a cause, and possibly many. I would not consider myself qualified enough to make suggestions, but I have heard many priests say that they would be very slow to encourage any young man into the Seminary system that they experienced. For many, more change is needed.

For the depleting number those of us who work in the ministry every day it is very sad and painful when these embarrassing injustices are raised, particularly for those who have loyally stood by the promises we once made. When I have often been told "you're wasting your life". In this article I want to tell you that we do feel hurt too. I am glad that I am a human being. Support from family, friends and parishioners is deeply appreciated by all of us.

SECOND WEEK OF EASTER

Acts 2:42-47. Ps.117. 1 Pet. 1:3-9. Jn. 20:19-31. Lect I: 438 7 Sunday The struggle for faith experienced by Thomas leads us to think on the meaning of faith in the risen Christ. We cannot depend on physical experience of Christ: outknow his presence in gathered community, in the hearing of the word and in acramental signs. So the Christian community is a thankful one, always blessing God for a sure hope through the resurrection of Christ.

The **fifty days** from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated as one feast day, sometimes alled "the Great Sunday". The singing of the Alleluia expresses the characteristic joy of these days

The weekday readings: the continuous reading from the Gospel of St John gives us the nderstanding of our Lord seen in the light of his resurrection and glorification; and a ontinuous reading from the Acts of the Apostles presents us with the Church of the Risen Christ now filled with his Spirit and continuing his work. These two series are read without ny intrinsic relation to each other.


