I believe our regional president of SVP hit the nail on the head recently when he wrote "our politicians have forgotten poverty or never experienced it, that they don't understand what its like to be in want, that they don't realise the damage done to the old, to children and to families, or is it simply *"indifference"* He went on to say: the Budget in its original form was a savage attack on the old, the young, the marginalised, the disabled and even though parts of the Budget have been withdrawn it remains a minefield of poverty traps the full affects of which will only become apparent as time passes. Does anyone in Government have the slightest idea of what it takes to balance your income at this level, constantly "robbing Peter to pay Paul"?

At SVP in Ballincollig we witness poverty and its effects on families; we are constantly faced with families who live from week to week struggling to make ends meet. We meet with the parent struggling without enough food to feed their children, who has to decide which bill to pay this week from their meagre income, be it the ESB, Gas, Rent or Mortgage, and decide to wrap up well to keep warm as there is no money to buy coal this week.

In the past year SVP has funded local projects including healthcare, clothing, home assistance, education, summer breaks, etc, and where someone is in need we are there to assist in every way possible. We depend on your generosity to fund our work and you have not failed us. The goodness and generosity of the Ballincollig parishioners powers us on to keep up the work of those who have served the local community so well over the past decades.

A Seasonal Thought

On a bitterly cold and blustery winter night, the pastor of an urban church knelt in the rector y. "Let me see your face, Lord!" he prayed over and over again. A knock at the rectory door disturbed his prayer. Reluctantly he rose to answer the door. Outside stood a dishevelled, shivering man who asked, 'Can I have some food?" The pastor led the man to the kitchen, scrounged in the refrigerator for a left-over, not too dried out sandwich. He poured a small glass of milk and added a tired

slice of pie before placing the food before the beggar. He waited a bit impatiently while the man ate. He offered little conversation, not wanting to prolong the time until he could return to his prayer. When the man had finished, the priest escorted him to the door. As he closed the door, he immediately resumed his prayer, "Lord, let me see your face". In his mind's eye the face of the beggar instantly appeared. Words something like, "You have seen me," echoed in his mind. The priest threw the door open. Though the street was long and visible, the beggar was nowhere in sight. The priest had stayed awake to pray, "Lord let me see your face" he mind the mean of the beggar.

"Lord, let me see your face," but today he believes he missed Jesus when he came to his door in the form of a beggar.

Probably each one of us has a similar story of a time when Jesus whom we long to see came to us in the form of one of his poor ones and we failed to recognise him.

During this Advent season we are to be on our guard lest we miss Jesus in the midst of our Christmas preparations.


