#### **First Holy Communion**

The month of May in the life of the parish is that special time of year when the children of second class receive their first Holy Communion. First Holy Communion is the second step on the journey to full membership of the Catholic Church; the sacrament of Confirmation completes that journey to full membership in the family of believers that we call the Church, sometimes referred to as the people of God. Recently during the Easter Vigil when an adult, Florence was baptised, she was also confirmed and received her first Holy Communion; that was the custom in the early church when Baptism was only for adults.

Today infant Baptism is the norm and it is the first step to membership of the family of Jesus on earth, the teenager taking the final step in the sacrament of Confirmation. Today I say well done to the parents who strive to be an example and inspiration to their children in Christian living; to the highly dedicated teachers in all our schools who work long and hard to prepare the children for three sacraments, First Confession, First Communion and Confirmation. Teachers in school can only build on the work in the home and this applies more in matters of faith and sacraments than in other areas of life. We are blessed in Ballincollig parish that a group of parents prepare the liturgy of the word each Sunday with the children at the eleven o'clock Mass in Christ our Light Church.

Being a Catholic today means having a reverence for the scriptures and authority; we are called to deepen and enrich the beliefs that have been given to us.

Being a Catholic means not just an intellectual assent to beliefs, but giving our hearts too. We are like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, whose hearts burned within them.

Being a Catholic means that, as Hopkins put it 'the world is charged with the grandeur of God'. God speaks to us through physical things, through bodies, through ocean waves, through bread and wine. We experience the world through our bodies and we need the concrete and the physical to help us experience the intangible. The earth is not ours to destroy, but to wonder at, to be protected and to be thankful for. When we gather for the Eucharist as Christ asked us to do, may our eyes be opened to Christ, who is both with us and beyond us at the same time.

### THE SUNDAY READINGS

#### First Reading: Acts 4: 8-12

Peter, who had once trembled before a servant maid is now fearless before the High Priest through the grace of the Holy Spirit as Jesus had promised. Instead of defending himself he preaches the new Faith. Salvation comes through the person of Christ, not through the rigorous observation of the Law, as the Jews believed.

#### Second Reading: 1 John 3: 1-2

Because God has adopted the faithful into his family the world hates them. But the adoption entitles them to a future state of glory, like that of God himself. The true nature of this glorification is not yet clear; but after this life faith will give way to the vision of God.

#### Gospel: John 10: 11-18

The image of the shepherd and the sheep is taken from many passages in the Old Testament. The single sentence "I am the good shepherd" would have called up much of sacred scripture for those listening to Jesus. In this lovely poetic passage, Jesus speaks of the affection that unites him with his followers. He looks beyond the Jewish nation to the whole gentile world where "the other sheep" await the call of the good shepherd. So much does the Good Shepherd love his sheep that he is prepared to lay down his life for them.


