Messages of HOPE

Isaiah uses the great image of the lamb lying down with the wolf and having nothing to fear to describe the messianic age. It is a picture of a time of universal peace -- the strong no longer prey on the weak or the cunning on the innocent.

The annual Console Christmas Celebration of Light will take place in the Sacred Heart Church (M.S.C.), Western Road, Cork on Sunday 8th December 2013 at 4.00pm. The Celebration of Light commemorates the lives of loved ones lost through suicide. It is an evening of song, music, poetry and reflection, which includes the lighting of a candle and a minute’s silence in the presence of others to remember those who are no longer with us on life’s journey. The celebration also serves to provide support through contact with the Console community. Light refreshments will be served after the ceremony.

Volunteers to put up Christmas Decorations for Older People

Christmas is a wonderful time of the year, but what if you are unable to put up Christmas decorations to give your home that festive feel? "Many older people, particularly those who live alone, cannot easily put up a Christmas tree or other decorations in their homes. Simply getting them down from the attic can be an impossible task" said Age Action Regional Manager John O'Mahony.

"We speak to so many older people who throughout their lives have decorated their home every Christmas but now find themselves unable to do so. Often people will have relatives calling with grandchildren during the festive season and they would like their home to be decorated for the family visit. We are offering to put up Christmas decorations for older people and take them down again in January"

All year round volunteers from Age Action's Care & Repair programme do odd-jobs and DIY work for older people free of charge. Jobs that volunteers can do include gardening, moving furniture, putting up smoke alarms, small repairs and small painting/decorating jobs. According to Mr. O'Mahony "The aim of the Care & Repair programme is to help people with tasks around the home that can become difficult as we grow older. Ultimately we want to support people to remain living in their own homes for as long as they wish in increased safety and comfort."

COPD

Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease

- Over 440,000 people have COPD in Ireland and by 2030 it is estimated that COPD will be the fourth leading cause of death worldwide
- Smoking is the leading cause of COPD about 85 to 90% of COPD deaths are caused by smoking
- COPD is also sometimes caused by other factors, such as over-exposure to smoke, dust or other fumes, so some people who have COPD may have never smoked before
- Symptoms of COPD include:
Frequent coughing or wheezing; breathlessness; difficulty breathing; and tiring easily from everyday tasks, such as climbing stairs or household chores

Those at high risk of developing COPD include:

- Any current or former smoker over age 40
- Someone who never smoked but has a family history of COPD, emphysema or chronic bronchitis
- Those with exposure to occupational or environmental pollutants
- Those with a chronic cough, sputum (matter discharged from air passages) production or breathlessness

Anyone with one of these risk factors should go to their GP and be tested for COPD

Early diagnosis is very important. COPD is diagnosed by your doctor through spirometry testing, a simple and painless test that takes just a few minutes. The earlier COPD is diagnosed the better, as it means improved quality of life and improved symptom control.
