## First Sunday of Lent

*Jesus fast of forty days reminds us that this is a holy season of self-denial. By rejecting the devil's temptations Jesus has taught us to rid ourselves of the hidden corruption of evil, and so to share his paschal mystery in purity of heart.*

### *The Season of Lent*

Today as I try to gather my thoughts it is Pancake Tuesday. There is a long standing tradition of making and having pancakes on the day before Ash Wednesday. Throughout the world this day is marked by festivals (carnival days) and Mardi Gras celebrations. Hopefully it is a day to give thanks for all the good things in our lives. Thanks for all creation, for our family and all those whom we love, for our Faith, for the mystery of God's love for us and the food we enjoy.

This year Pope Francis asks us to take a look at the great Lenten journey ahead. The Pope goes on to pray that this Lenten season may find the whole church ready to witness to all those who live in material, moral and spiritual destitution, the Gospel message of the merciful love of God our father who is ready to embrace everyone in Christ. May we support one another on this journey and be encouraged by the Holy Spirit working in us.

**THE SUNDAY READINGS**

First Reading: Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7

The Lord God created Adam and Eve and set them in the Garden of Eden. They had all they needed, but the serpent tempted them, and they disobeyed God's command.

Second Reading: Romans 5:12-19

Gospel: Matthew 4:1-11

Following his baptism in the Jordan River, Jesus went out to the desert to pray and understand God's will. He was alone in the desert for 40 days and nights. Works in solidarity with men and women who are homeless, offering housing and support in their journey back to independent or supported living. In 2013, over 1,000 people turned to Cork Simon Community for support. Cork Simon relies on hundreds of volunteers to undertake its work and to help to fundraise over 2 million euro each year to maintain its services. Cork Simon is seeking volunteers for its Annual Bag Pack Fundraising Drive taking place in Cork and Kerry on April 4th, 5th and 6th. If you would like to get involved by giving up two hours of your time to bag pack in your local Tesco or Dunnes please contact kerry on 021 4929410. Volunteering in your local community is an opportunity to make a meaningful contribution to supporting the work of Cork Simon and supporting people in finding a pathway out of homelessness.

Among Cork Simon's most well known services are the Emergency Shelter and the Soup Run. Cork Simon's Emergency Shelters has 48 beds and is full every night of the year while the Soup Run operates every night of the year, offering nourishing food and a listening ear and is often the first point of contact for people who become homeless in Cork. Cork Simon Community also provides housing at five high-support houses throughout the city for people with health needs that require 24 hour care and 27 flats throughout the city for people who are leaving homelessness behind them. In addition to accommodation, Cork Simon offers support to people to maintain their tenancies', access to health services, training and employment opportunities and a range of personal supports to enable people to move out of homelessness.
