Getting to Know You!

On June 9th 1984, 22 years ago, I drove from my family home near Clonakilty, to the Church of Christ Our Light in Ballincollig for an ordination ceremony. My ordination!

Ever since, Christ Our Light has been a place of special memories for me. The last time I visited was for my godson Marc's, 1st communion. (We will now be neighbours in Westcourt!) My previous visits to the Church of St Mary and St John, have been for occasional funerals, and also for the baptism of my friends baby, Cormac.

Now I am in Ballincollig to serve as your priest. Since my arrival I have been greatly encouraged by the warmth of the welcome with which you have greeted me. Thank you! I am impressed too, with the large numbers attending church and the level of involvement of people in parish life.

I come with a little trepidation, as it's my first appointment to full-time parish ministry. Following ordination I volunteered for the Peru mission where I spent 4 fulfilling and adventurous years. On return I became a school chaplain, something I have worked at for 14 years, with a hectic 4 year stint as a Healthcare Chaplain at Cork University Hospital, between school appointments. I come to you, from Glanmire Community College where I had the privilege of serving for the past 8 years. At weekends I assisted in the parish of Glanmire. And as if that wasn't enough, I also lectured for Mater Dei Institute, delivering an outreach M.A. programme, as well as regularly presenting at school inservice courses, on Critical Incident Management. (That schedule was just TOO busy!)

As I take on the challenge of parish ministry, I look forward getting to know you, as I negotiate my way around the local estates and town-lands. My vision of church is for an inclusive, open and caring community where nobody feels excluded by reason of race, status or orientation. I value good quality liturgies that relate to life, with maximum participation from all involved. So take this is an invitation for a volunteering opportunity of you are not already involved in the life of the parish! I believe in devoting time to preparing my homilies, so I hope that what I say will resonate with some aspect of your lives and make a connection with the gospel.

I am generally good humoured, easy going and informal, so I trust that you will find me approachable. And when not working, I have a passion for cars, art, computers and the beach!


