

It is with the same type of parishioner in mind, especially the young, that we have decided to put "The Parishioner" on the Web. Over the past few months the team has put many hours into setting up the website. The site will be available this weekend and when "The Parishioner" comes back at the end of August it will appear in its entirety on the World Wide Web. We would encourage parents to note the website address and send it to their children whether they live in Dublin, London or further afield. Most young people have access to the web and are familiar with its use. We have been fortunate in getting an address, "BALLINCOLLIGPARISH", (one word, note!) that is so obvious to remember.

At a click of a switch they will now be able to find out who died at home, who got married, who had a baby, etc. We would hope too, that they might read the religious content of the newsletter as well. The email facility should also prove useful to the young people arranging their wedding from abroad.




