Our World Today

This Saturday June 11th the parish council members will meet for five hours in the Community Hall. The members of the council generously give their time and talents to serve the Christian community in the parish of Ballincollig. This parish has been enriched for more than ten years by the vision and commitment of successive Parish Councils. In many ways the members of the Parish Council help us all "to follow Christ and live according to his will." The Gospel passage this weekend from St Matthew urges us in the words of Christ, "Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Samaritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge. Proclaim the kingdom of God is close at hand." In our world today, our parish has many kingdoms I believe that our calling is to bring the kingdom of God to all situations as a leaven; as a mirror to reflect the closeness of God.

Throughout the world there is a debate going on as to a vision for the future of the Church. The collapse of vocations to the religious life and the virtual collapse of the Catholic system across most of Europe is causing many to reflect on the future of the Church. Some see the small remnant communities of the present Church throughout most of Europe as a parallel with the situation of the early Church. As at the beginning of the church, the small Christian communities are called to offer a horizon of kindly light, simply by being different. By expressing openness for the many wounded people around us, in refusing corruption, in educating our children towards a deep and joyful faith in Jesus in the perspective of the resurrection.

St. Matthew also tells us that when Jesus was addressing the crowd, He felt they were harassed and dejected – "like sheep without a shepherd" –Jesus tells the crowd the harvest is rich but the labourers are few. He follows up by saying "ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest."

Not everyone can be directly involved in the work of salvation, but everyone has a part to play in the overall plan.

I don't think that at this time the Christian community is a minority remnant; but one action that is required is evangelisation and that the current culture represents fertile ground for this. Perhaps we would keep one another in our thoughts and prayers.

The custom of invoking Anthony to find lost articles may have arisen from this incident: a novice ran away, carrying off a valuable Psalter Anthony was using. Anthony prayed for its recovery and the novice was compelled by an alarming apparition to come back and return the Psalter.
