The author of the Letter to Titus exhorts the communities to adhere to Paul's teachings. He begins by stressing the qualifications needed by Church leaders and by Christians in general.

14 Tuesday Tit. 2:1-8,11-14. Ps. 36. Lk. 17:7-10. Lect II:864 We are to behave properly so that the message of God is not disgraced. We are to live as Christ lived in his human existence, as we wait in hope for his return. This befits us as servants who are only doing their duty.

15 Wednesday Tit. 3:1-7. Ps. 22. Lk. 17:11-19. Lect II:866 Because God has shown his gracious love for us when we were unworthy sinners, we should imitate God and love our fellow human beings freely. God's love requires our continous thanksgiving and praise.

(There exists no Christian option to enslave others because of race, sex or religion.) The gospel redresses inequalities. Philemon is a remarkably relevant epistle for our times. **Tuesday 14th** - St. Laurence O'Toole became a monk and abbot of Glendalough. He was made Archbishop of Dublin in 1162. He returned to Ireland after the Third Lateran Council as papal legate in 1179. He died at Eu in Normandy in 1180 where he was seeking to make peace between Henry II and the Irish rulers.



**Friday 17th - St. Elizabeth** 1207-31, Queen at 14, wido wed and exiled at 20. Franciscan tertiary until her death at 24. A woman of prayer and service of the poor.

# THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF LANCIANO

During our recent Parish Millennium Pilgrimage to Italy, we visited the Church of St. Legontian which has contained for over twelve centuries, the first and greatest Eucharistic miracle of the Catholic Church. This wondrous event took place in the 8th Century, as a divine response to a Basilican monks doubt about Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist. During Holy Mass, after the two-fold consecration, the host was changed into live Flesh and the wine was changed into live Blood, which coagulated into five globules. Since 1713 the Flesh has been reserved in a silver osten sorium and the Blood is enclosed in a very old cup



of rock crystal. Scientific investigations were carried out over a number of years. The analyses were conducted with absolute and unquestionable scientific precision and they were documented with a series of microscopic photographs. These analyses sustained the following conclusions. The Flesh is real Flesh, the Blood is real Blood. The Flesh and Blood belong to the human species. The Flesh consists of the muscular

tissue of the heart. The Flesh and Blood have the same blood type: AB. The preservation of the Flesh and Blood which were left in their natural state for twelve centuries is extraordinary. Over the centuries pilgrims have come in large numbers to this Church and we hope they will continue to do so. We were blessed to have the opportunity to visit this special place.
