Two Banquets

Isaiah uses the image of a rich banquet on God's holy mountain to describe the fulfilment of God's promise of a salvation of joy and everlasting happiness where every tear will be wiped away and death will be no more. This intensely human image of fulfilment and joy has come down to us from about 500 BC. All are invited to the banquet of rich food and fine wines, where death will be destroyed forever, every tear wiped away and shame taken away throughout the earth, where God's people will exult and know that they are saved.

Today's Gospel reading also speaks of a banquet, a wedding feast representing the kingdom of God. But in this third parable of rejection in Matthew's Gospel, those invited refused to come. Some were busy, preoccupied with farm and business, others were hostile. The messengers were then sent to the crossroads to invite whoever they met to come to the wedding feast, an open invitation to all. And not all of those who came were welcome. The guest who did not wear a wedding garment represents those who pay lip service to the Christian life but are not in practice prepared to take it seriously.

We too may at times refuse to pay attention to God's invitation. We may be busy, or we may have bought into value systems or lifestyles at variance with the Christian ideal and may not want to hear the message. The reasons for refusing the faith and refusing to try to live up to it are similar.

Even now God's promise is before us in our day to day life. St Paul tells us that God will meet our needs as lavishly as only God can, and today's Psalm reminds us that if we take the Lord as our shepherd, then goodness and kindness will follow us all the days of our life. The banquet is at the end of time, but the invitation is now and the response is now. This week we pray that we will say yes to God's invitation, that we will say yes to God's promise, that we will say yes to God's love. We will try to bring that invitation to the world around us, even at the risk of rejection. We will try to give witness to our own faith by our lifestyle and by our joy in the Lord..

Matthew dealt harshly with the wedding guests who made excuses for not attending the king's son's wedding. Not only did they refuse the invitation, but they beat the servant who went in search of them. The king knew that there would be those who appreciated the banquet and sent more servants out to the crossroads to find anyone willing to come. Matthew ended his Gospel with what was probably a separate parable. Someone dressed inappropriately was removed from the banquet. Most likely, Matthew intended his listeners to respond appropriately to God's invitation.

Monday 13 – Weekday (28th Week in Ordinary Time) Tuesday 14 – St Callistus I, pope and martyr. After a life of slavery and imprisonment for criminal offences, Callistus was freed and became a deacon in charge of the catacombs that bear his name. He became Pope in 217, opposed by Hippolytus. He died at the hands of a mob in 222.

Wednesday 15 – St Teresa of Avila, virgin and doctor of the Church. Teresa, 1515-1582, deeply contemplative, highly active and practical, established Carmelite convents under a reformed rule, and wrote much on prayer and the spiritual life. She is patron of lace-makers and headache sufferers.

Thursday 16 – Weekday

Friday 17 – St Ignatius of Antioch, bishop and martyr. Ignatius, bishop of Antioch, died a martyr at Rome about 107. He urged Christians to unity in and through the Eucharist and around their local bishop.

Saturday 18 – St Luke, Evangelist. Luke, the author of the Third Gospel, is represented in art by an ox. He is patron of butchers, book-binders, doctors and surgeons, artists and glassworkers.
