Holy Week

From Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, we reflect on the final week of Jesus' life; from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his last meal, trial, crucifixion, death, and resurrection. These are important events in our faith journey.

We see in today's readings how Jesus suffered as a human person. During his time of suffering he experienced terrible loneliness. His disciples fell asleep in the Garden when he needed their support. They ran away as soon as people came to arrest him. It even seemed that his Father had abandoned him when he cried out: 'My God, My God why have you forsaken me'. Yet because of His great love for us, Jesus accepted his Father's will by suffering and dying to save each one of us.

Today, as we reflect on all that Jesus endured for our salvation and that of the whole world, we remember too all who are suffering at this time: our own our personal sufferings, be they physical, mental, or financial; the sufferings of our world; the heartbreaks endured by families that do not have adequate food, clothing or shelter; the grief experienced by those suffering from war and natural disasters; Let us unite these with the suffering of Jesus, praying that all may receive the grace and strength they need.

Each Holy Thursday we remember the institution of the Eucharist which gives us nourishment for our journey. We also recall Jesus washing the Apostles' feet and his words: 'If I then, the Lord and Master, have washed your feet, then surely you must wash one another's feet.' In washing the feet of his apostles Jesus gave us an example of humility and showed how love and service are expressed in action. In what ways am I the hands, the feet, the eyes of Christ for others?

On Good Friday we are invited to be actively involved in walking in spirit with Jesus on the road to Calvary, by participating in the outdoor Way of Cross through the streets of Ballincollig - which begins at 12 noon at the Church of St Mary and St John. Let us journey with Jesus and each other throughout this Holy Week.

Reflection for Parents

There is much to reflect on in this reading. One interesting note, however, is the different responses Judas and Peter had when they came face to face with their rejection of Christ. After his three denials, Peter "wept bitterly." These tears of regret led the way to reconciliation when Peter first encountered the risen Christ. Judas, on the other hand, knew what he did was wrong, but he couldn't face the hopelessness his actions brought. To relieve the pain of what he had done, Judas took his own life. Some days it is difficult (even beyond measure) to be a parent. The lesson we learn today is that reconciliation and healing bring us long-term joy instead of living in the harsh bitterness of despair.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

The servant of the Lord was rebuffed but did not turn back; he was beaten and spat upon. The suffering one knew the Lord God was with him.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

Christ was in the form of God but did not consider equality with God a thing to be grasped at. He emptied himself, took the form of a slave, and was obedient unto death! Therefore, God exalted him, and all proclaim him Lord.

Gospel: Matthew 26:14-27:66

Each year on this Sunday we follow the events of Jesus' life from the time he entered Jerusalem until the point where he was laid in the tomb after his crucifixion. Jesus first entered Jerusalem riding a donkey amid waving palm leaves. It was in Jerusalem that he foretold Judas' betrayal, Peter's denial, and established the Eucharist at the Passover meal. Jesus took his disciples into Gethsemane to pray, but they could not stay awake with him. In the garden, Jesus was turned over to the authorities, tried before the Sanhedrin, brought to Pilate, and sentenced to death. When offered a choice during the festival to release a prisoner, the people chose the release of Barabbas. Their choice was beyond Pilate's comprehension, so he symbolically washed his hands of the whole deal. Jesus was turned over to the Roman authorities for crucifixion and mocked by them. Finally, Jesus died on the cross. The earth darkened and quaked. He was prepared quickly for burial and laid in the tomb.

The Riots in Marsh's Yard.

Muskerry Local History Society are organising a lecture on the riots in Marsh's Yard which will examine the circumstances, both political and economic, which culminated in the tragic shooting dead of 22 year old, Michael Patrick Lynch, and the wounding, by gunfire, of seven others at the auction yard of Wm. Marsh & son, Copley Street, Cork on Monday, 13 August, 1934.

The early years of the 1930's provide the background to this talk which will be held on Tuesday, 15 April at 8.15 pm in Ballincollig Rugby Club. The various aspects of that era including the Land Annuities, the Economic War, the Blueshirts and the tensions still existing from the Civil War will be highlighted as well as the list of casualties showing some local involvement. The shootings, the perpetrators and the court findings will also be discussed.

World War 1 Participants

At least 152 young people from Ballincollig and its surrounding parishes served in WW1.
