One Spirit, Many Gifts: A Parish Staff

What amazing stories we find in the Acts of the Apostles that is read throughout Eastertide at mass. Acts provides the earliest description of a community of believers, a prototype of today's parish community. The first disciples, accustomed to meeting underground or in homes, might not recognize the steeples and doors of today's church structures. After a series of appearances of Jesus to the fearful disciples, to instruct and encourage them, Jesus promises that his own Spirit will enter their hearts and empower them to go out to the whole world to make other disciples. Their encounter with the risen Christ and his instructions to them inspired remarkable stories, and each successive generation has extended the life of the church. The critical question for us today, is how do priests, parish staffs and the voluntary committees and teams that work with them, bring this same encounter with the risen Christ and the promised Spirit into the practical realm of running a parish, developing programs, planning events and being a pastoral presence to the community?

As a parish grows and the demands are ever greater, more help is required to serve new needs being identified. This may occur in part through invaluable voluntary service, but paid employees of the parish are also required. As new areas of pastoral need are defined; new job titles and descriptions, responsibilities and organizational charts are required as multiple ministries emerge. The same demands today were evident too in the early church as it grew, with the disciples reserving their time and energy for prayer and preaching by naming others for the ministries of caring for the widows and orphans, managing finances and feeding the poor. This form of delegation today would resolve similar concerns.

A Parish staff needs to be organised along professional structures imitating other leadership models found in successful organisations or businesses and influenced by our own culture and environment. But as a structure we must also struggle to understand and emulate the spiritual beliefs, development, and practices of the early church. Along with the descriptions in Acts, the letters of St. Paul invite and ignite our imaginations and hearts on how to be church. In 1 Cor 12:3-13, Paul gives us a powerful image of how a community functions. There are different kinds of gifts but the same Spirit. These passages breathe life and inspiration into our understanding that many charisms are given for building up the church.

Women in the church especially have brought fresh metaphors and meaning to pastoral ministry. Ministry in a parish, even when inspired by the Holy Spirit, still requires dedicated hard work, real skills, professional practices and good process to help all who minister, successfully serve the people. Some of the issues that a parish staff (priests, lay leaders, pastoral council etc) will have to grapple with include: communication, conflict resolution, decision making, accountability, task and relationship work, teamwork, evaluations, supervision, problem solving, mission clarification, visioning, collaboration and leadership development. All who collaborate together in pastoral ministry must determine how to employ everyone's gifts to serve the parish community effectively. Staff development time and workshops can offer opportunities for a staff to grow and develop together.

People in parish pastoral ministry are under a microscope. They are observed by many, praised by some and criticized by others. Every day they have the opportunity to act as the body of Christ with many members and many gifts. How do we support and honor the gifts of each member? Areas of responsibility and accountability are often sorted out on the run. What worked in the past or in one setting may not always work in another. Whatever issues arise, parish staff members can offer a wealth of experience and insight when they tackle them together. There are different gifts, different tasks, but the same Spirit at work in everyone for the common good.

To adapt to new challenges, to the voice of the Holy Spirit, we are called to continually break out of familiar patterns and comfort zones. Openness to the Risen Christ will always breathe new life into our structures. The Spirit will empower us to act toward one another as disciples.

Reflection for Parents

Today's Gospel is especially helpful when we have to explain death to our children. Jesus told his disciples that if they truly loved him, they would be happy that he was going to be with his Father. While the words are sometimes hard, even for us as we face a loss through death, our faith lets us know that Jesus and our loved ones are truly happy in a way we can't fully understand. Jesus offered the Spirit to the disciples because he knew the days ahead would be hard for them. It is that same Spirit that helps our families and us when we face hard days following a death. The greatest news in this reading is that Jesus will be back for us!

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 15:1-2. 22-29

One problem in the early Church was whether Christ meant his message for the Gentiles or only for the Jews. The apostles met in council at Jerusalem and decided to preach to the whole world.

Second Reading: Apoc 21:10-14. 22-23

The ancient Jews loved the city of Jerusalem, the site of the temple and the centre of their religion. In the Second Reading for today, John describes the Church as triumphant as a new and glorious city, the New Jerusalem. That new city is a symbol of the Church as she is today and she will be in the future. Gospel: John 14:23-29.

In this Gospel, Jesus prepared his disciples for his return to God. Jesus promised them that the Holy Spirit would live within them and provide strength and courage. The Spirit would always be available to help them as a counsellor and advocate. Through the Spirit, they would recall the words and teachings of Jesus and even come to understand these things in a way that they could not before. In addition the disciples would receive peace from the Spirit. The peace of the Spirit would be a "shalom" kind of peace which provided a special inner serenity.
