I'd like to thank those of you who came along last Wednesday to take part the special liturgy to mark World Day of Sick. Thanks to those of you who made your own special effort and thanks to those who helped to bring a family member, relative, friend or neighbour. Thanks to all who supported our gathering in any way?

Today again in the Gospel Christ the Healer is again among the sick and this time stretches out his hands and touched the leper. It may seem an extreme example of Jesus' outreach to the sick. There's no logic to it. There are no rules. He's doing something new. He touches the leper. Wow. And the leper is cured. And then the odd reversal of lifestyle. The leper goes into community and Jesus is isolated and almost becomes a leper. And yet the community still seeks Him out and wants to be touched; touch His cloak; to be close.

The gesture of touch in our lives has particular connotations for many of us. Some like and others dislike. The gesture of touch can convey so much and in the right context it certainly conveys accompaniment, intimacy and oneness.

In recent days again we have seen local hospitals having to restrict visiting due to the presence of infection. The danger of touch or proximity to others increases the likelihood of the spread of infection. We have seen the terrible effects of Ebola in some parts of Africa. While many people died I have been struck by the equally harsh effects that Ebola has had on day to day lives. In recent interviews with an Irish missionary sister from Donegal she has spoken of the sheer devastation of the lives of family and communities. It is after the example of Christ the Healer that many are drawn to all sorts of disciplines to be there for those who are sick and in need. The Gospel is Good News as once again it tells us of the extraordinary events of the Incarnation.

Christ is speaking and acting with authority and so pushes the boundaries beyond the logic to the realm of mystery. The Incarnation, and our sharing in this incarnate presence by our words, touch, look, acknowledgement are signs and gestures which transmit something of the human and divine spirit, heart, love. There's to be, as I see it, in our living in family, community, society a desire for the good and the desire that creates presence and uplifts individually and collectively. Lord bless us in our gift of touch to others and through your Spirit of Wisdom and guidance let it always convey something of love and presence.

Reflection for Parents

Not many things break the heart of a parent so quickly as seeing their child rejected by another person. Sometimes children are cruel and shun others or exclude them. Even more difficult are circumstances where adults or someone once trusted turn away from a child. Most of us don't witness these acts in our lives personally, but we certainly read about them in the paper or hear about them on the news. We get just a small glimpse of what it might have been like for the leper in today's gospel who was not even allowed to live with healthy people. We also better understand the courage and compassion of Jesus who touched the man and accepted him.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46

The Hebrews always regarded leprosy as a contagious disease and perhaps as a punishment by God. This explains both the isolation of the diseased person and the necessity of ceremonial purification. In some societies AIDS is similarly regarded today.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10: 31- 11:1

This is a cry for tolerance at a time when Christians who had come from the Jewish tradition tried to impose their customs on converts from paganism. The scrupulous are not entitled to impose their scruples on others. Tolerance and kindness must be mutual.

Gospel: Mark 1: 40-45

Lepers were compelled to lead an isolated life, wearing a special garb, and giving notice of their approach by crying out: "Unclean", in order to prevent contagion. Jesus cured the man but spoke sternly to him because he had violated the prudent regulations by coming into contact with others who might receive the contagion.
