## **Pentecost**

With the story of Pentecost, and the coming of the Holy Spirit, we hear how the disciples were huddled in the upper room, afraid of the Jews and terrified of the unknown. Even though they had been chosen by Jesus to spread his message, they were too scared to move. So they locked themselves away, afraid of life. Only when the Holy Spirit arrives are they transformed from ordinary people into fearless missionaries.

Pentecost is the birthday of the church. The word means the Fiftieth Day. Let us think about the story, so far. We have seen Christ in the world, sowing the Spirit of God. We have seen this Spirit work among the blind, the sick, the hungry and the outcasts of society. We have seen Christ condemned to death, and then return from the tomb. We have seen him coax his disciples to raise their eyes and look beyond their own world. Jesus told them that he must now go back to his Father but not to worry, as he will send his Holy Spirit to be with them forever. The disciples still seem upset, perplexed, dumbfounded and disappointed, shut away in an upper room.

Perhaps we can understand how these disciples felt. Imagine being a small child and your parents tell you that they are going away for a while; you feel frightened, vulnerable, angry and abandoned. That is how those first disciples must have felt.

Their leader was leaving them, the one they had put all their hope in, the person that gave meaning to their lives and in whom all their aspirations and inspirations were placed. Who would they turn to? What were they going to do now?

We all want to cling to someone we admire, love and depend on. We can't bear the thought of their leaving. Jesus had to go away, he sent the Spirit to them. Jesus had to go – it was important that he left his apostles to carry on without him.

So what about us? There are times when we are afraid. We hide in our rooms, we hide in the dark, hoping that we won't be seen. We are afraid to be disciples and witness to the presence of Christ in our lives.

The followers of Jesus were given the ability to speak the languages of all those who were gathered in the city and beyond. God gives us the gift to understand one another so that we may communicate the Good News in a way that people can hear it in their hearts and put it into action.

We still need the Spirit, to help us realise the power we have within, the power we have to make our world a better place. Let us pray for the courage, coming through the Holy Spirit, to change our lives so as to reflect the presence of Christ in the world.

# SAINT OF THE WEEK

## St. Bernadine of Siena 20-May-2005

Saint Bernardine of Siena was born in 1380 in a town near Siena, Italy. His father was an Italian governor. When he was seven, his parents died and he was taken in by relatives who loved him as if he were their own. He received a good education and grew up to be a tall, handsome boy that everyone loved to be with.

Bernardino's charismatic preaching filled the piazze of Italian cities. Thousands of listeners flocked to hear him and to participate in dramatic rituals, which included collective weeping, bonfires of vanities, and exorcisms. He was a renowned peacemaker, in the Franciscan tradition, who tried to calm feuding clans and factions in the turbulent political world of the Renaissance. His preaching visits would often culminate in mass reconciliations, as listeners were persuaded to exchange the bacio di pace, or kiss of peace.

Bernardino was sensitive to the demands of secular life, and tried to negotiate between Christian ethics and a conflicting code of honor that stressed retaining face in a public world. He argued that the catalyst of civil discord in the urban setting was malicious gossip, which led to insults, and, too often, vendetta by aggressive males. His surprising allies in his peacekeeping mission were the women who comprised the majority of his audience..

At twenty-two, Bernardine joined the Franciscan order. Several years after becoming a priest, he was assigned to go to towns and cities to preach. He is known as a great reformer, who encouraged devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus. He is known for his use of the monogram, IHS. He died on May 20, 1444, at the age of sixty-four in Aquila, Italy. He was declared a saint in 1450, by Pope Nicholas V. Saint Bernardine is the patron of advertisers and advertising; he is invoked against hoarseness.
