Matthews Gospel Reflections

The stories of Matthew's Gospel often refer the life of Jesus back to the Hebrew Scriptures and this would likely have caused friction with the Jewish community. The fact that both orthodox Jews and Christians both considered the Hebrew Scriptures as their own meant that there would have been a certain rivalry between them. Not surprisingly, the authors of Matthew latched on to stories that reminded them of famous Hebrew accounts. The story of the Holy Innocents is meant to remind readers of the pharaoh's attempt to kill all infant Jews before their liberating exodus from Egypt while Jesus' birth and the flight to Egypt from which the Holy Family returns is designed to make the claim that Jesus was a leader on a par with Moses, that he had travelled across the desert and had brought a message of hope and salvation for his people. There are other examples too and sometimes the language is uncompromising. We hear Temple priests (Saduccees) and Pharisees (lay orthodox preachers) castigated as "vipers" (Mt 3: 1-12 reference) and there is a threat of axes laid to the root of trees in reference to the old ways. In general, there is an apocalyptic tone to these declarations. They are meant to signal that a new age has dawned, that the old ways are past, that the Messiah has come. In the meantime such bold statements are probably the fruit of a rejection by Jewish orthodoxy of these claims. Their tone reflects the degree to which they had been banished from the centre of Jewish worship, their banishment perhaps from Jerusalem itself. As a result the Gospel makes frequent reference to persecutions Mt 13:21; 10: 22; 10:18 and betrayal 24:12 reflecting some turmoil in the period before the composition of the Gospel. The dominance by Rome of Jerusalem and its public, religious and cultural life after Titus sacked the Temple in the year 70 would also have sharpened these differences, since both sides could claim intransigence by the other as the reason for such catastrophe. At any rate it seems clear that the main centre of the new Christian movement turned to Antioch in the 70s..

THE SUNDAY READINGS

Gospel: Matthew 11:2-11.

John the Baptist had disciples of his own and while in prison he sent some of them to Jesus. At John's request, the disciples asked Jesus if he was the Messiah or were they to wait for another. Jesus did not answer them directly, but pointed to the miracles he had performed in the name of God's love. If John himself did not wonder, it was likely that his followers did. Jesus did not fit the image of "Messiah," and so it was possible that people began to doubt their original perception.
