How often fear and anxiety prevent people from producing their best, from using their God-given talents to the full. In today's parable Jesus shows that a God who inspires fear may inspire little else. His image of God as a loving father inspires confidence and so enables us to develop what he has given us.

What Talents Has God Entrusted To Us?

In today's Gospel we hear the story of the man going abroad who entrusted his property to three servants. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one. At that time, one talent was probably equivalent to a whole lifetime's wages for a servant, so they were being entrusted with something of great worth. Later they would be held accountable as to how they used these talents.

What gift and talents has God entrusted to us? Faith is a precious gift we have received and with it comes the responsibility to nurture it and to share it with others. God has also given each of us special gifts and talents to use - not to hoard them! At times we may make excuses not to use them, forgetting that the Lord has freely given them to us to be developed and used for the service of his Kingdom. Like the servants in the Gospel story, we too will be asked to give an account of how we used these gifts and talents.

Sometimes, we may be tempted to compare ourselves with others. Just because we perceive others as possessing more outstanding gifts and talents, we conclude that there is nothing much we can do. It doesn't matter whether we've been given many talents or few, what is important is that we do the best we can to use whatever God has given us for his work. What he gives us, is in proportion to our ability to use them. No one can say I have nothing to offer! Sadly the third servant did not have the courage to be a risk-taker. Often we don't know what the Lord will ask of us; we might be asked to do things that seem impossible. Once we have the courage to take the risk, then God will bless our effort and help us to discover gifts we didn't realize we had!

Maybe this week-end we can take time to reflect on our own God-given gifts and talents. St Peter says: "each one of you has received a special gift, so like good stewards responsible for all these varied gifts of God, put them at the service of others"(1Peter 4:10). We ask God to help us to be aware of our gifts, to appreciate them and to use them generously. We pray in gratitude for the many people who give so generously of their time, gifts and talents in the service of our parish community..

The first two servants invested the money during the master's absence and it yielded great returns. The third servant, however, was fearful of investing (or some scholars say he was lazy). In either case, the servant buried the money he was given and returned the full amount to the master when he came home. The master was pleased with the investments of the first two servants, but was very upset with the third one. To those who have much, much more will be given. 
