The servant of God, who defends God's mercy and truth before others, must be ready to face rejection, violence, even death. Today we are reminded that God supports those who accept a cross - not for its own sake but for the sake of Christ and the Gospel.

ST. ANTHONY

St. Anthony of Padua is probably one of the best loved saints in all the litany of the canonized. Indeed, so numerous were the miracles worked during his life time and immediately after his death that Pope Gregory IX inscribed him within a year of his death in the calendar of saints of the cathedral of Spoleto. In the decree of canonization the Pope declared that he had personally known the saint. The same pope when he heard one of his sermons in Rome was astonished at his profound knowledge of the Holy Scriptures. That fame was well founded and was shown by his several works: "Exposition of the Psalms", was written at Montpellier in France, and "Sermons" written at Padua, Italy. Because St. Anthony's name is so inextricably linked with Padua, few know that

he was in fact born in Lisbon in Portugal. That was in the year 1195 - just over 900 years ago. At the age of fifteen, Anthony joined the Augustinian Order just outside the Lisbon city walls. Gifted with a bright intelligence and a prodigious memory, (perhaps that's why he finds things that were lost!), he soon gathered from the Bible a vast knowledge of God's revelations to man.

When he was twenty-five years old he was present when the bodies of some Franciscan Fathers who had been martyred in Morocco were brought home. Immediately he decided to join the Franciscans in the hope that some day he could preach Christianity to the Saracens. However, a serious illness prohibited him from travelling to Morocco. Instead he taught theology as a Franciscan in Montpellier and Toulouse.

It was as an orator rather than a professor that St. Anthony became most famous. He had a loud and clear voice, a winning appearance, wonderful memory, profound learning and his holiness was attested by an extraordinary gift of miracles. His last years were spent preaching to huge crowds in Padua where he died at the age of thirty-six years.

Over the centuries the fame of St. Anthony has never diminished and even at the present day he is acknowledged as the greatest miracle worker especially in the recovery of lost objects,

In the church of St. Mary and St. John we now have a shrine to St. Anthony. This has come about by a strange series of events. Someone placed an order with Maurice O'Donnell, the sculptor, for a statue for a church in the Diocese of Cloyne. When the Donor died before the work was completed the statue was left on the sculptor's hands. When an enquiry was made to purchase it for this church, we were told that it had already been sold. Some time later it emerged that two families had got together to present it to our church. The same people, who wish to remain anonymous, also paid for the pedestal which was made by the Cloghroe Joinery in the village. In this round about fashion, the beautiful statue of Anthony receiving a vision of the Christ Child has found a permanent home in our parish church.

READINGS FOR THE WEEK

17 Sunday Is. 50:5-9. Ps. 114. Jm. 2:14-18. Mk. 8:27-35. Lect 1:799 Peter speaks up and acknowledges Jesus as the Christ. But he finds it hard to accept that Jesus must suffer and die because of who he is. So also Christians find it hard to accept the Cross as an integral part of their identity.

18 Monday 1 Cor. 11:17-26, 33. Ps. 39. Lk. 7:1-10. Lect II:763 The tradition of the Eucharist that Paul has handed on involves more than just the ritual action. It also means really recognising the presence of Christ in the gathered community. There must be no divisions among them as they come together to celebrate the memorial of the Lord.

19 Tuesday 1 Cor. 12:12-14, 27-31. Ps. 99. Lk. 7:11-17. *Lect II:765* When Paul speaks of the community of faith as a body, he really means to relate it to the living physical body. Each member lives only as a part of the whole body; once amputated it is dead.

20 Wednesday 1 Cor. 12:31-13:13. Ps. 32. Lk. 7:31-35. Lect II:767 Amidst the arguments and controversies there are three things that will endure: faith, hope and love and the greatest of these is love.

21 Thursday Eph. 4:1-7. Ps. 18. Mt. 9:9-13. Lect II:1198

22 Friday 1 Cor. 15:12-20. Ps. 16. Lk. 8:1-3. *Lect 11:772* The primary reality for the Christian is the resurrection of Christ. Christ's resurrection is to be seen as the first-fruits of our resurrection.

23 Saturday 1 Cor. 15:35-37, 42-49. Ps. 55. Lk. 8:4-15. Lect II:774 As we have shared in the fall of Adam by the fact that we shall die, so we shall share in the resurrection of Christ with a risen body like his.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

Tuesday 19th - St. Januarius bishop of Benevento, was martyred at Naples in 305, with six companions

Wednesday 20th - The Korean Martyrs The faith in Korea started and had to depend for its development on lay leadership until some French missionaries arrived in secret in 1836. During the persecutions from 1839 to 1867, 103 martyrs, mainly lay people from all walks of life, witnessed to the faith. Andrew Kim was the first Korean priest and Paul Chong was a lay apostle. They are remembered for their fearless witness in the face of torture and death.

Thursday 21st - St. Matthew the tax collector, may also be identified with Levi, son of Alphaeus, in Mk. 2:13. He is said to have been a missionary in Persia and Ethiopia. Patron of accountants, book-keepers, tax-collectors, customs officers and security guards.

Saturday 23rd - St. Euanan became a monk in Iona. He himself was chosen as abbot in 679. In 697 he came to Ireland and promulgated the law known as Cain Adomnáin which exempted women, boys and clerics from military service. He died in 704.


