### The Feast of Corpus Christi

The Feast of Corpus Christi comes during the week following the major feasts of Pentecost and Trinity Sunday. Might it not be more appropriate to celebrate the feast on Holy Thursday when we celebrate the first Eucharist? Jesus took the bread and breaking it and sharing it he said: This bread, this breakage, this sharing is my body. Jesus took the wine and while handing it on and drinking it he said: This wine, this drinking, this sharing is my blood.

All this was not only a rite, all this was not only a touching gesture to be repeated, all this left us with a mission. This mission of building his body, by sharing our bread. This is a task we cannot fulfil on our own. This task will depend on my relationship with the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. This task will be fulfilled slowly by our human decisions in the light of our faith in Jesus. What happened to the bread and the wine that night should happen to the whole of humanity, to the whole of creation.

De Chardin once saw this occurrence clearly while adoring the Blessed Sacrament. He saw in a vision, how suddenly the Host started to grow and grow, until It contained the world, interconnecting the whole of humanity. Suddenly he understood, suddenly he saw. That changeover will not happen by some magic. That changeover can come only as the growth of His body through the words spoken and the deeds done in the light of what He started that evening, the day before He died. May the Eucharist continue to inspire us to build the kingdom Christ proclaimed.

I look forward to good support for the Eucharistic procession on Saturday evening after the six o'clock Mass.

I take this opportunity to say a sincere thanks to all who planned and helped in various ways to organise the Eucharistic procession.

### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading Exodus 24:3-8

Moses seals the Covenant between Israel and God with the blood of a sacrifice.

Second Reading Hebrews 9:11-15

The old covenant of atoning for sins with the blood fo sacrificed animals is compared to the new Covenant of atoning for sins for all time with the blood for Jesus - the perfect sacri-

Gospel Mark 14:12-16,22-26

Jesus instructs two of his disciples to go into the city to prepare the group's Passover meal. The disciples find everything just as he predicted. There, Jesus shares his Last Supper, which becomes our Eucharist feast.

Summary of the Three Readings:

The story of Moses in Exodus describes the old covenant, sealed with the blood of a sacrifice. The story of Jesus in Mark's Gospel describes the start of the new Covenant: after the meal the group goes to the Mount of Olives, where Jesus is prepared to seal the Covenant between people and God with his own blood, the blood of a perfect sacrifice. The explanation in the letter to the Hebrews compares the high priest of the old covenant to Jesus, who is the new high priest of the new Covenant.

# Irish Cancer Society

- 90% of all skin cancers are preventable. Virtually, all the risk comes from the sun & sun beds/sunlamps.
- About 80 85% of the suns rays can pass through clouds so you need to take care on cloudy days too.
- Damage to the skin by the sun is permanent. It also builds up – that means damage to the skin in one year is added to damage done in previous years. In later life this can lead to skin cancer.
- Skin cancer can take 20 to 30 years to develop, so the rates of skin cancer today reflect the trends of the 70's
- Ultraviolet Radiation from sunlight and sun beds/ sunlamps is the main risk factor for skin cancer.
- In Ireland, one in every eight men and one in every ten woman develop skin cancer by the age of 74 years.
- The number of skin cancer cases is rising every year.
- Ireland has among the highest skin cancer rates in
- Two-thirds of Irish people have a higher risk of developing Skin Cancer because of their skin type.
- Irish people are exposed to the sun more often than in the past (mainly due to holidaying abroad).
- A tan has become more fashionable in Ireland than in the past. This puts us at greater risk of developing skin cancer in later years.




