Clustering of Parishes

Bishop Buckley announced a change in the organising of parishes at a meeting of parish representatives in March. The decision arose from the work of group f people working in conjunction with Bishop Buckley recommending that the parishes of the diocese be clustered. There will be seventeen clusters (groups of parishes) and Ballincollig will join Ovens / Farran and Kilmurry (including Cloughduv and Canovee). Each parish will retain it own boundary. This clustering will become effective from September 2008. Each cluster will have a priest appointed as a moderator (organiser). This proposition of clustering parishes is to deal with reduced number of priests available to work in the diocese, the increasing age profile of the clergy and the small number answering the Lord's call to serve as a priest or religious. The clustering of parishes will also enable parishes to work together in providing training for ministry, preparing and promoting the involvement of the people of God in their parishes.

I have attended a number of meetings where presentations were made on clustering of parishes. The possibility of inviting priests from elsewhere to come and work in Cork and Ross diocese was raised. This proposal doesn't seem to be actively on the agenda at present.

This proposal of clustering of parishes by church authorities seems to me to be following the same route as the closure of post offices, Garda stations, creameries and other services in many communities. I think we need to address the question WHO are the church? Do the Bishops and priests constitute the church in each area? In discussing these questions, we should remember that the sacraments, ministries and grace are gifts made by the Holy Spirit to the Church, The People of God not exclusively to the Bishops and priests.

In the earliest church the right of the community to celebrate the Eucharist was taken for granted and the leaders of the communities also lead them in celebration of the Lord's Supper. The Acts of the Apostles and St. Paul in his letters writes about Eucharistic communities; these early Christian communities met regularly to pray, tell the story of Christ and break bread (celebrate Mass). Perhaps the present difficulties provide an opportunity to review structures of ministry with a view to recognising what developments in ministry structures are now obstacles to the Church's development ..

Monday 19 – Weekday (7th Week in Ordinary Time) **Tuesday 20** – St Bernadine of Siena, priest. St Bernadine was born in Siena in 1380. He became a Franciscan and travelled through Italy, preaching with great success. He promoted devotion to the Holy Name and to St Joseph. He died in 1444. Wednesday 21 – Saints Christopher Magallánes priest, and Companions, martyrs. These twenty-five priests and laymen were executed in 1927 in Mexico.

Thursday 22 - St Rita of Cascia, religious. St Rita, 1386-1457, was married for eighteen years. Her husband, an ill-tempered and abusive man, was murdered. Later Rita entered the Augustinian convent in Cascia and spent forty years in prayer and charity and working for peace in the region.


