THE READINGS AND THE END OF TIME

The Gospel we have just read, and the other sayings of Jesus in the same vein, have often led people at various times to predict the end of the world. But the point of this Gospel is not to bring us all to live our lives in some kind of holy terror. True, as Christians we accept that heaven and earth will pass away. There is a related theme in today's Gospel - that of being aware, of reading the signs of the times. Of realising that God is present to us in the here and now, and present as a loving and forgiving Father. The signs of his presence are all around us, when we see love, forgiveness and compassion - and sometimes challenge. The great pity is that many people spend so much time trying to figure out how and when God will show himself to the whole world in the future. For they fail to see how he is showing himself to them individually in the present.

19 Sunday Dan 12:1-13. Ps. 15. Heb. 10:11-14. 18. Mk. 13:24-32. Lect 1:826 The mystery of faith that we celebrate in the Eucharist proclaims that Christ will come again. That is the main fact, and the details of that coming, the imagery we may use to describe the meaning, are extras to impress our senses.

20 Monday Rv. 1:1-4. 2:1-5. Ps. 1. Lk. 18:35-43. Lect 11:875

The Apocalypse has the literary form of allegorical narrative. Using traditional images of cosmic combat, it looks at the confrontation of the followers of Jesus with the Roman Empire. The community of Ephesus is praised for the stand it has taken on leadership, but its practice of Christian love is not what it should be.

21 Tuesday Rv. 3:1-6,14-22. Ps. 14. Ik. 19:1-10. Lect ||:877
The communities of Sardis and Laodicea are not praised but are called to repentance, to start all over again with the basics.
Presentation of the BVM Zech. 2:14-17. Ps. Ik. 1:46-55. Mt. 12:46-50. Lect ||:1271 It is an early belief that Mary was presented to be brought up in the Temple.It symbolises her total dedication to God 22 Wednesday Rv. 4:1-11. Ps. 150. Ik. 19:11-28. Lect ||:880|

John is given the vision of the heavenly court where God reigns with the saints whose function is to praise and adore God.

23 Thursday Is. 52:7-10. Ps. 95. Lk. 9:57-62. Lect II:1277
St. Columban, also widely known as Columbanus, was born around 543. He became a monk of Bangor and later principal teacher there. In 591, desiring to "go on a pilgrimage for Christ" he set out with twelve companions and came to Burgundy. He established monasteries at Annegray, Luxeuil and Fontaine according to the severe Irish Rule. His criticism of the moral life of the court led to his banishment. He crossed the Alps around 613-14 and made his last and greatest foundation at Bobbio, where he died in 615. He left a valuable corpus of spiritual writings. One of the greatest of the Irish missionary monks.

SAINTS THIS WEEK

Wednesday 22nd - St. Cecelia the patroness of music and musicians, was a second or third century Roman Christian martyr. According to tradition, she refused to worship the Roman gods and was beheaded. Her association with music and the representations of her playing the organ probably grew from a misunderstanding of a fifth century account of her life.

Friday 24th - Sts Andrew Dung-Lac, priest and companions Through the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries in Vietnam, many Christians suffered martyrdom. On 19 June 1988 Pope John Paul II canonised 117 of these, 96 native Vietnamese men and women, 11 Dominican missionaries from Spain, and 10 French missionaries.

St. Colman mac Lenine Colman mac Lenine was born around 530, probably in West Cork. A bard by profession, he is reputed to have been influenced by Brendan to become a priest. The main field of his apostolate was East Cork, where his chief foundation was in Cloyne. He died in 606


