# Lord Show Us the Way

To-day's Gospel is taken from the farewell conversation Jesus had with his disciples on their last evening together before facing his passion and death. They must have been upset, anxious and fearful that Jesus was about to leave them and wondering how they will continue without him. Like the disciples, maybe we too in times of fear and anxiety, of separation and death may feel that all is lost. We may even lose our faith and trust in God. We question our own direction in life and wonder what's going to happen to us and the people who are dear to us. We hear Jesus speak encouraging words to his disciples which he also speaks to us in these situations: "Do not let your hearts be troubled, trust in God still, and trust in me".

Jesus tells the disciples that he is going to the Father's house to prepare a place for them so that they too may be with him. They are puzzled when he goes on to say 'and you know the way to the place where I am going'. Thomas is quick to react: 'Lord we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus reminds them – and us – 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me'.

Jesus' questioning response to Philip can be a challenge for us to reflect on: "have I been with you all this time Philip and you still do not know me?".... How well do I know Jesus and how do I nurture my relationship with him? Are there times that I am as blind as Philip was blind to the God who walks among us, blind to the possibility that we can make a difference in a world so full of suffering. As a Christian community we are called to journey with Jesus, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

We are pilgrims on this journey of faith. Jesus is our way to the Father - he walks with us every day, listening, guiding and supporting us until the day that he himself will come to bring us home to the Father's house - to the place he has prepared for us.

Let us ask Him: 'LORD, SHOW US THE WAY'..

# **Reflection for Parents**

Often it is easier for our children to trust the words of Jesus than it is for us. Like the disciples, we can be a bit apprehensive not seeing Jesus. After all, it would be easier to follow someone if we could actually see where he is going! Instead, the words of Jesus challenge us to have faith in him and trust where the journey leads. The example of our lives should always point our children and us toward the rooms Jesus prepares for each of us.

#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7 There were complaints that certain widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food. Seven deacons were appointed to oversee an equitable distribution of food.

#### Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9

Christ is the cornerstone, precious to God. All who believe are "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own" called to proclaim the Gospel.

#### Gospel: John 14:1-12

During Jesus' Last Supper, Jesus explained to the disciples what was to happen next in God's plan. Jesus would no longer be visibly among them, but would return to the Father. In heaven, Jesus would prepare a place for each of us to come when he returned to get us. In his discussion, Jesus also made it clear that if we know him, we would also know God—that they are one in the same. The way for us to be with the Father is to follow Jesus.

#### Scout News

Last Saturday Morning bright and early at 7.30 am, 8 scouts gathered at the scout hall, to head off to Kerry, to take part in the hill walking part of the Scout County Shield. We had entered two teams in the event. When the teams arrived at the base of Mangerton Mountain, their route cards and gear was checked and they set off up the mountain with all their gear including enough food to last 24 hours, tents and sleeping bags. There was a leader tagging along with each team as well. Along the way there were checkpoints as well as bases where they had to carry out set tasks as a team. When they got to the top of Mangerton, (height 839 m.) The snow was coming down heavily and the wind was picking up. The teams had their lunch and set off for the next part of the challenge, which was to hike to their overnight campsite, in Cappagh valley. Sounds easy when you say it, but in reality it was 6k away and in their way a mountain called Stoompa 694m .The teams followed the ridge and down the valley to the campsite (Campsite = flat piece of ground and nothing else) After pitching their tents the scouts set about cooking dinner on their portable stoves, every morsel of food was eaten with great relish. The scouts were fit for nothing but the bed. In the morning after breakfast the tents were packed away and the hardest part of the weekend, the last 5k walk out to the road and home. The teams will have to wait until the weekend of the County Cup to find out their results. Some of our modern Grandmothers are so young and spry they help scouts across the road.

#### This Week's Calendar

**Monday 21** – St Anselm, bishop and doctor of the Church. Anselm, from Lombardy, joined the monastic school at Bec in Normandy in 1059 under the direction of Lanfranc whom he succeeded as Archbishop of Canterbury. He was exiled twice and died in 1109.

Tuesday 22 – Weekday (5th Week of Easter)

Wednesday 23 - St George, martyr. George was venerated as a soldier saint at Lydda in the Holy Land where he was probably martyred around the year 300. His cult may have been popularised in England and Ireland by returning crusaders. He is patron of England, Portugal, of soldiers and of the Scout Movement.

Also, St Adalbert, bishop and martyr. Adalbert, born 956, after being bishop of Prague, went as a missionary among the Prussians on the Polish coast where he was martyred in 997. **Thursday 24** – Easter Weekday

Today is the anniversary for the solemn inauguration in 2005 of Pope Benedict XVI as Supreme Pastor of the Church.

**Friday 25** – St Mark, Evangelist. Mark was closely connected with the preaching of Ss Peter, Paul and Barnabas. His Gospel was probably written at Rome, when he was with Paul, and is traditionally viewed as representing St Peter's approach to the meaning of the good news. His symbol is a winged lion. **Saturday 26** – Easter Weekday


