### Wedding Feast

Jesus - The Invited Guest to the Wedding Feast

The best until last

Is He first or last on our guest list of life and its unfolding events?

No matter how popular or how unpopular we might feel we are at times most of us have experienced what it is like to be involved in organising and hosting a special occasion like a birthday party, a wedding reception, an anniversary party, a family reunion, a station mass, a school event.

Life provides us with due reason to remember and celebrate significant occasions and events in our lives.

Even when we are small we have our list of friends who we are eager to share our toys and our joys with and there are others who haven't quite managed to impress us and so we inevitably exclude them.

And we know too that there are some people who are very talented at organising these things and they are the sort of people you put on your invitation list straight away because you can rely on them and depend on them to help things run smoothly.

Today's Gospel reading reflects the interaction that took place with Jesus in the ordinary events of everyday life. He often revealed, taught, healed and transformed situations which made things that much better for those who encountered the dual effects of His divinity and humanity. Jesus and his mother Mary at a wedding reception in Cana.

They are invited guests and turn out to be guests with human understanding and consideration for their hosts who find themselves without the necessities. The miracle of Jesus changing water into wine at Cana is a statement regarding his giving of something of his humanity and his godhead to others.

This is the mystery of Jesus' embodiment of the human condition and the incarnation of Jesus as the word made flesh and evermore dwelling among us. The mixed response is of both a human and godlike nature.

Jesus was able to fulfill a short term human need but also reveal the gifts of the infinite that he offers to all who would invite him to be their guest in the significant moments of our lives.

It is no coincidence that the sacraments of the Church run alongside and parallel with birth, childhood, adolescence, adulthood, sickness, old age, death. As I see it Jesus wishes to be in partnership with us throughout our lives. The readings today speak of Jesus' partnership with us in terms commonly applied to marriage. It is Jesus who is the eternal bridegroom joined to his people.

How is our partnership with Him going?

**Blood Donation Urgent Appeal**

The public are being urged to give blood this month in light of dwindling supplies nationwide.

The Irish Blood Transfusion Service (IBTS) is calling on people to donate blood over the next few weeks to bolster depleted blood supplies and to ensure the service can meet demand from hospitals.

Nationally IBTS have between four to five days' supply in the three major groups, O-positive, A-positive and O-negative. The requirement is six to seven days supply.

**THE SUNDAY READINGS**

First Reading: Is 62:1-5

God's people will be shown to be right; this will be their day of vindication. God will take his people to himself, like a bridegroom, like a new husband.

Second Reading: Cor 12:4-11

People have many different gifts. Nevertheless, the Church is united, because all these gifts come from the one God.

Gospel: John 2:1-11.

While the Wedding in Cana is a familiar story, it only appears in John's Gospel. Scholars call it the first of Jesus' signs.

Mary, Jesus' mother, observed that the wine was running low at a wedding feast she and Jesus were attending. She didn't specifically ask Jesus to do something about the situation, but he understood the implication. He instructed the servants to fill six stone jars with water and then take some to the waiter in charge. The waiter was surprised that the bridegroom had saved the best wine for last. The servants were surprised because they knew the jars were filled with water and they had witnessed something remarkable.

**Baptism Preparation**

**Clergy and Religious Orders  
Donate almost €1m to Trócaire**

Donations from individual members of the clergy and the Religious Orders to Trócaire amounted to almost €1m in 2012. Members of the clergy donated €765,866 of their own personal income to Trócaire last year, while the Religious Orders made donations amounting to €150,977.
