THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Zech. 12:10-11; 13:1

The Prophet Zechariah announces that the Messiah will suffer, and that people 'will look upon the pierced One'.

Second Reading: Gal. 3:26-29

St Paul speaks of the unity which faith brings.

Gospel: Luke 9:18-24

Jesus asked his disciples who the people said he was. He learned that some said he was John the Baptist while others thought he might be Elijah. He asked the disciples themselves who they thought he was. Peter, speaking for all them, said he was the messiah, the one that Israel had been waiting for. Jesus immediately told them to say nothing of this to anyone because he had much yet to suffer. In order to help his followers understand the commitment of discipleship, he explained that they must take up their own crosses--that is, make sacrifices--in order to follow him

SAINT OF THE WEEK St. Thomas More 22-June-2004

Martyr (Patron of Lawyers) St. Thomas More was born at London in 1478. After a thorough grounding in religion and the classics, he entered Oxford to study law. Upon leaving the university he embarked on a legal career which took him to Parliament. In 1505, he married his beloved Jane Colt who bore him four children, and when she died at a young age, he married a widow, Alice Middleton, to be a mother for his young children. A wit and a reformer, this learned man numbered Bishops and scholars among his friends, and by 1516 wrote his world-famous book "Utopia". He attracted the attention of Henry VIII who appointed him to a succession of high posts and missions, and finally made him Lord Chancellor in 1529. However, he resigned in 1532, at the height of his career and reputation, when Henry persisted in holding his own opinions regarding marriage and the supremacy of the Pope. The rest of his life was spent in writing mostly in defence of the Church. In 1534, with his close friend, St. John Fisher, he refused to render allegiance to the King as the Head of the Church of England and was confined to the Tower. Fifteen months later, and nine days after St. John Fisher's execution, he was tried and convicted of treason. He told the court that he could not go against his conscience and wished his judges that "we may yet hereafter in heaven merrily all meet together to everlasting salvation." And on the scaffold, he told the crowd of spectators that he was dying as "the King's good servant-but God's first." He was beheaded on July 6, 1535. His feast day is June 22nd.

Diocesan Pastoral Strategy

Following the issue of the Draft Pastoral Strategy, The Ballincollig parish meeting was held on 28th April 2004. Two questions were open for discussion at the meeting. The first question was; how do we need to develop so that there is true partnership in the way we live and celebrate our Christian faith? The following points were made.

More prayers were required for Vocations, and we should give better example to our children by showing respect for clergy. We should establish where priests are under pressure, and try and help by putting new structures and partnerships in place that would encourage people to participate in parish activities; also former priests and nuns should be encouraged to become involved.

The church, that is clergy and laity need to be proactive rather than reactive, and we need to do more through the Secondary schools as it is at this stage that we loose many of our younger members. If we could only carry forward the enthusiasm of primary school, things would be easier.

Perhaps the most important word is partnership. It was felt that without this partnership, more people will leave the church. There was a strong feeling that more of the admin tasks should be done by the laity and spiritual tasks done by clergy, At the same time it was suggested that there was a need for more formal religious education among the laity.

The following suggestions were also made. Church Liturgy should be more ''alive'' and ''creative''. Sunday Mass must be memorable. It should 'stay with us for the entire week' should we consider a different form of liturgy to recognise the shortage of priests and the need to involve the laity.

Our children's mass is going very well can more children be involved?

Should we create more parish groups to deal with, bible studies, novenas, bereavement counselling, teenage involvement in Liturgy and various ministries, church music.

Are existing groups "exclusive"?

Can we use pre marriage and other courses to bring people closer to the church and could we make more use of secular feasts such as Mothers and Fathers day.
