Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The enemies of Jesus try to put him on the horns of a dilemma. Would he offend the Roman occupiers or the sensitive Jewish nationalism? Jesus rises above the situation by reminding them, that God is the supreme authority but yet we all have duties to the civic society in which we live.

Mission Sunday

The theme for this Mission Sunday is "Growing in Faith". During the summer Pope Francis' first encyclical, entitled 'Light of Faith' was issued. It had been partly written by Pope Benedict before his resignation and was completed by Pope Francis. The following is a short extract: "As the Year of Faith comes to an end, it is an important opportunity to strengthen our friendship with the Lord and our journey as a Church that preaches the Gospel with courage. Faith is God's precious gift, which opens our mind to know and love him. Faith, however, needs our personal response, the courage to entrust ourselves to God, to live his love and be grateful for his infinite mercy. It is a gift, not reserved for a few but offered with generosity. There is an urgent need then, to see once again that faith is a light, for once the flame of faith dies out, all other lights begin to dim."

In the Gospel, Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. Jesus addresses a challenging question to us: 'when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?' Faith is not something that we can take for granted. Jesus encourages us to remain faithful to God in prayer and not to 'give up' even when the going gets tough. In our first Reading God asked Moses to lead his people to the Promised Land. Even though they had to face hardship and battles, Moses continually reminded them that their God was with them. It was due to Moses' perseverance in prayer on their behalf and the support of those around him which helped them through all they had to endure. It is so easy to 'lose heart' and drift away from prayer especially when we're going through a difficult time. As a Christian community we do not journey alone and during difficult times it helps to know that others are supporting us in prayer.

On this Mission Sunday, we are reminded that we are all brothers and sisters in God's family. We have a duty to be especially concerned about those members of his Body who are less fortunate than ourselves. We thank God for the generosity of our Missionaries and for the generosity of the people at home supporting them financially and in prayer. We pray that we will always receive the grace to remain faithful to God.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Exodus 17: 8 - 13

The first reading for today gives an example of persistence in prayer. As long as Moses continued to pray, the Jews were victorious in battle; when he stopped praying, they began to lose.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14 - 4:2

In the second reading, Paul tells Timothy, the bishop, to remain faithful to his teachers and to Scripture. We, too, must be faithful to tradition and revelation.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Like a relentless child, the widow in Jesus' parable wouldn't give up. She continually begged the judge for justice against her opponents. Not because the judge wanted to see justice done, but because he grew tired of the woman's pleading, he granted her request. The point Jesus wanted to make with this story is how much our loving God will answer our prayers if we persist in our asking.

In the case of the Diocesan Needs collection, the quarterly collection has decreased from an initial amount of €78,000 in Quarter 4, 2011 to an average of €65,000 throughout 2012, to approximately €56,000 in quarter 3, 2013.


