First Sunday of Lent

As we begin Lent again, we learn that we need to be purified of our sins. Jesus went out into the desert to be put to the test for us, to overcome Satan. If we go into the desert with him, whatever is evil in our lives can be overcome.

The Season of Lent

Our word "Lent" comes from an old English word Lencfen, meaning to lengthen or to grow longer. These days, at least in the Northern Hemisphere, each day there is two minutes more light in the morning and two minutes more light in the evening. So, "Lent" really means springtime. This tells us precisely what is supposed to happen in this springtime of the faith: new shoots, spring growth, signs of life and joy. So, whatever I undertake this Lent, may it lead to a new springtime of faith for me and my community. (First Sunday Of Lent - St Paul's Missal, 2015, p110)

During the season of Lent the Christian traditions of prayer, daily Mass, the rosary, the Stations of the Cross, fasting, abstinence, denial, Alms-giving and so on come to mind. For each of us there are a wide variety of interests that we as Christians could pursue. As I quoted earlier from St Paul's Missal perhaps you might like to come to Sunday Mass that bit early and spend a bit of time reading and reflecting upon God's word or indeed a little saving here and there could prompt the purchase a Sunday or Weekday Missal as a resource for reflection.

Others during Lent like to take on what is considered to be acts of charity like visiting the sick at home or in hospital or offering something of their time and energy to various charitable organisations and causes. Lent is a time that affords the Christian community through its prayer and liturgy to enter into a spirit of renewal, penance, reconciliation. In the coming weeks as part of our 150 year celebration of the beginnings of our Parish we are having a week-long Mission from Monday 2nd March to Friday 6th. There will be Mission Mass at the Parish Church of St Mary's and St John's @ 7.00am & 9.30am with Liturgy, Homily & Prayer each evening @ 7.30pm. There won't be any evening Masses during the Retreat. The Mission will be an opportunity to once again give attention to the foundational elements of our spiritual and religious traditions while keep in mind the need for fresh approaches and renewed commitment.

Making an extra effort for Lent prepares the way for understanding the whole dimension we call the Paschal Mystery. The Paschal Mystery is the unity of Christ's life, suffering, journey to Calvary, His death, and is completed in the Resurrection. Making any effort is beneficial to the soul and the inner spirit that dwells in all of us.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Genesis 9: 8-15

God made covenants or agreements with men on three occasions in the Old Testament: with Noah, Abraham and Moses. These covenants implied that man agreed of his own free will to serve God. In return God would forgive and take care of mankind. The rainbow was aptly chosen as the sign of the covenant as rain from heaven had been one of the causes of the flood.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 3: 18 - 22

Noah and his family were saved not only from water but by water, i.e. the water carried the ark aloft. In the same way the water of baptism saves us. The flood was a type of baptism that purified mankind.

Gospel: Mark 1: 12 - 15

Mark gives only a summary account of the temptation of Christ. Satan wished to discover whether Jesus was the Messiah and, if possible, to lead him from the path of suffering, which God had ordained as the course to be followed by the Redeemer. Mark alone mentions the wild beasts whose presence suggests the desolate character of the region to which the Lord had retired. John the Baptist was now in prison and Jesus went into Galilee where John had preached and began by repeating the call to repentance.
