Matthews Gospel - Fourth Sunday of Advent

Matthew's Gospel opens with a puzzle. In the first section, a genealogy is presented tracing Jesus back through Joseph to David. The claim is made through the paternal line from Jesus back to David. No other Gospel presents such a list or such a genealogy and one wonders why it is there. The next section presents an entirely different reading of the credentials of Jesus. This time it is stated that he is the son of Mary and indeed that he was conceived before she came to live with Joseph (Mt 1: 18) by the power of the spirit. The text stresses the fact that Joseph was not the natural father of Jesus, a strange conclusion in view of the genealogy story above. A third story is equally strange and is presented in Mt 2:1 as astrologers saw a sign in the sky. They interpreted the sign as saying that something extraordinary was about to happen and when they came to Herod we are told that he was very disturbed. Three signs or accounts, all pointing to the same fact, that the birth of Jesus Christ was significant. There is a mixture here of three stories that would carry special meaning to three specific religious groupings. The first are orthodox Jews and a group known as Ebionites who believed that Jesus was an ordinary human being, naturally conceived and born. The second are those who believed that Jesus was specially elected by God in a manner they did not yet understand but which involved both the promise of God, the faith of Mary and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The third were the pagan believers particularly Zoroastrians who paid particular attention to the importance of star signs. All of these groups are being pointed towards Jesus, the son of Mary, mother of the Church, and are being called to pay attention to his particular message..

Fourth Sunday of Advent

We are about to take our final step in preparation for our Christmas meeting with Christ. In the Gospel we hear the words spoken to Mary: "Do not be afraid". Let us place our trust in God, who is very near us. With open hearts may we embrace the grace of our Saviour.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

The first reading contains Isaiah's prophecy of the events we celebrate at Christmas.

Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7 Paul's message is another reminder of what we are preparing to celebrate.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

Matthew recounts the circumstances of Jesus' birth by telling us the story of Mary's engagement to Joseph and the child she carried originating from the Holy Spirit. This reality made no sense to Joseph, but he did not want to dishonour Mary so he planned to quietly divorce her. An angel came and told Joseph not to be afraid, that Mary's child was conceived by the Holy Spirit and that they should call him Emmanuel meaning, "God is with us."

You may wish to make a very private prayer or pray perhaps for somebody who can't be with you this Season. Maybe say thanks for something or somebody!


