Tragedy & Hope

During the past month our TV screens and print media have been dominated by two tragedies, the news of the Tsunami shocked us on St Stephens day as we saw and heard the damage inflicted and loss of lives suffered by poor people from this massive earthquake and wave. There has been a huge outpouring of support and help all over the country and in particular here in Ballincollig. The Infant of Jesus sisters (Drishane sisters) have a big presence in the district through schools in Thailand. Sr Elizabeth has been invited by the primary school principals to speak to the sixth class pupils and some pupils are planning to write to pupils in Thailand and others will come up with other projects that will help the people of Thailand and also give us a better understanding of the Thai culture and the various ways that they are recovering from the effects of the disaster.

The other tragedy that has dominated our news and shocked us was the disappearance of Robert Holohan, near Midleton. The long search and eventually the discovery of Robert's body truly gripped the people of the country. Thousands of people helped the Gardai and Army with the search. The discovery of Robert's body brought an end to some speculation and also gave his parents a funeral and burial of their son Robert. I am sure that Roberts's parents and family had never thought that such a heavy cross lay ahead of them in life. Our prayers and thoughts will continue to be with Robert's family and everybody caught up in this very sad and horrific tragedy.

During the past week and longer there has been lots of speculation in print and in chat as to possible motives for abducting a child. I heard plenty speculation also about possible perpetrators of the abduction, this kind of speculation in another age would have been called gossip, I know I took part in this gossip myself. We all know that gossip can take a person's character and once taken cannot be restored, so perhaps we could all look into our own heart and if and when I am tempted to speculate (gossip) about people in the future I might ask the good Lord for the strength to bite my lip and pass on that opportunity.

The Gospel this Sunday is the call of Simon and Andrew. Christ said, "Follow me". The Lord is calling each of us to follow him, we say yes maybe out of courtesy, and perhaps we could live that yes with some conviction. Simon had a change of name to become Peter to denote his total commitment to Christ, we still have that custom. Young people preparing for Confirmation will take a name for their confirmation, perhaps as parents we might rediscover the significance of taking a name for confirmation and take some part in helping your child choose a name that will be some help, example or encouragement to them on their journey witnessing for Christ in our world.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 8:23 - 9:3

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Those who lived in the land of gloom now have joy, for the yoke that burdened them God has smashed.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

Paul wrote to the people of Corinth: let "there be no divisions among

... be united in mind and in the same purpose." I have heard "that there are rivalries among you. . . . Is Christ divided?"

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

The reading today from Matthew's Gospel takes place early in Jesus' ministry. Several ideas are clear. First of all, Matthew strived to connect his Gospel for the early Christians to their Jewish heritage. He made several references in his Gospel like the one today in which prophecies of old are fulfilled in Jesus. The second thing was that Jesus learned of John the Baptist's arrest and resolved to begin his ministry away from Herod. Finally, Jesus called with some urgency, his first four disciples. The common thread to all this was that God's Kingdom was at hand.

•••••• SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Thomas Aguinas 28-January-2005

Thomas the Apostle challenged the story that the Lord was risen, and his unbelief brought forth a glowing testimony of the reality of the Resurrection. Twelve centuries later, his namesake, Thomas of Aquino, questioned; without doubting; the great truths of faith, and demonstrated for all time the relationship of faith and reason. Thomas, son of the count of Aquino, (b. 1225-d. 1274) was first trained at the Benedictine abbey of Montecassino, and here, even in childhood, his great mind was wrestling with theological questions, "Master, tell me--what is God?" In order to better to train the boy's mind, his father sent him at an early age to the University of Naples. There he studied under Peter of Ireland and, undisturbed by the noise and wickedness of the great university city, proceeded rapidly on his quest for God.

Like many gifted young men, Thomas was bitterly opposed by his family when he attempted to become a religious. When both threats and persuasion failed, he was kidnaped by his brothers and locked in a tower for more than a year. His sisters were sent to influence him, and he proceeded to convert them to his own way of thinking. A woman was sent to tempt him; but he drove her from the room with a burning brand from the fire; afterwards, angels came to gird him with the cincture of perpetual chastity. When captivity failed to break his determination, his brothers relaxed their guard, and Thomas, with the help of his sisters, escaped from the tower and hurried back to his convent. Thomas was given the finest education available in his day. He studied first at Cologne and later at Paris, under the Master, Albert the Great. This outstanding Dominican teacher and saint became his lifelong friend and loyal defender. They taught at Cologne and became a mutual influence for good in one of the most beautiful friendships in Dominican history.

For the rest of his life, Thomas was to teach and preach with scarcely a day of rest. What makes the amount of writing he did remarkable, was the great deal of travelling that he undertook. Death found him in a familiar place, on the road, where he was bound for the Council of Lyons in obedience to the pope's command. He died at the Cistercian Abbey of Fossanova, in a borrowed bed, obscurity hardly fitting the intellectual light of the Order, but perfectly suited to the humble friar that Thomas had always been.

St. Thomas Aquinas is a Doctor of the Church and is honoured as the patron of Catholic Schools. He is celebrated in the Church Calendar on January 28th.
