A Courageous Woman

This week's gospel story featuring the courage of the Samaritan Woman at the Well prompted me to share this forthright open letter, addressed to all Christians, written by a courageous mother. It gives a most compassionate insight into the pain that homophobia can cause. I found it to be a moving testimony, and a challenge for all who claim to be Christian.

"I am the mother of a gay son and I've taken enough menace from people claiming to have the moral high ground. I'm tired of your foolish rhetoric about the "homosexual agenda" and your allegations that accepting homosexuality is the same thing as advocating sex with children. You are cruel and ignorant. You have been robbing me of the joys of motherhood ever since my children were tiny.

My firstborn son started suffering at the hands of little thugs from Christian, upright families from the time he was in Primary school. He was physically and verbally bullied right through Secondary school, because he was perceived to be gay. He never professed to be gay or had any association with anything gay, but he was called "queer" incessantly, starting when he was 8.

In his teens, while your children were doing what others that age should be doing, mine labored over a suicide note, drafting and redrafting it to be sure his family knew how much he loved them. My sobbing 17-year-old tore the heart out of me as he choked out that he just couldn't bear to continue living any longer, that he didn't want to be gay. I don't know why my son is gay, but I do know that God didn't put him, and millions like him, on this Earth to give you someone to abuse. At the core of all your misguided beliefs is the belief that this could never happen to you, that there is some kind of subculture out there that people have chosen to join.

If you want to tout your own morality, you'd best come up with something more substantive than your heterosexuality. You did nothing to earn it; it was given to you. My own heterosexuality was a blessing I received with no effort whatsoever on my part, it is so woven into the very soul of me, that nothing could ever change it. For those of you who reduce sexual orientation to a simple choice, a character issue, a bad habit or something that can be changed by a 10-step program, I'm puzzled. Are you saying that your own sexual orientation is nothing more than something you have chosen, that you could change it at will? If that's not the case, then why would you suggest that someone else can?

Some of you can't bear the thought that as my son emerges from the hell that was his childhood he might like to find a lifelong companion and have a measure of happiness. It offends your sensibilities that he should request the right to visit that companion in the hospital, to make medical decisions for him or to benefit from tax laws governing inheritance. You claim that these very human and civil rights would threaten the very existence of your family and would undermine the sanctity of marriage! However there are vast numbers of religious people who find your attitudes repugnant. God knows my son has been honest in accepting himself as the beautiful human person God has created".

Second Annual Butterfly Ball

"Cancer is a disease that unfortunately touches all our lives, no matter who you are. It's a devastating disease and part of the ethos of our charity is providing the best support for cancer patients and their family. This ball is our way of raising money to help the Irish Cancer Society with the invaluable work they do. They provide a Night Nursing service for critically ill patients with cancer in their home. This service is vital to relieve the difficulties that families experience during this time. Night Nursing allows the patient to remain at home, thereby maintaining the continuity of care that the patient has experienced, surrounded by their family and supported by the home care team. Night Nurses sit with the patient through the night, providing nursing care, practical support and reassurance. The Night Nursing service has now been extended to cover patients with cancer during stages other than terminal illness e.g. respites care. This allows the family time to rest and take a break from their very demanding caring role. Last year over 1,000 families throughout Ireland availed of the Irish Cancer Society Night Nursing service. It is currently provided for seventy hours, between 11 pm and 7 am. The service is free of charge."

Second Reading: John 4:5-42

Jesus approached a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well and asked her for a drink of water. This surprised the woman for several reasons. In the first place, it was unlikely that a man would ask a woman for anything and even more unbelievable that Jesus, a Jew, would ask something of a Samaritan, a great enemy of the Jewish people. Jesus explained to her that our thirst would return if we drank water from the well; but if we drank the water Jesus offered us, we would never thirst again. After Jesus told her many things about herself, she came to believe that he was the Son of God and called others to him.


