Thirtieth Sunday In Ordinary Time

The Pharisees fault was not gratitude for doing good hut contempt for those less successful, a lack of humility before the grace of God. Paul too could 'boast' and give thanks that he had kept the faith, but he recognised that this had not been simply his own doing but because 'the Lord stood by me.' We too should thank God for any good we have been able to do. It is with his help that we do it, and it gives us no grounds for complacency or a sense of

superiority.

Vocation Awareness

All of us are members of the mystical Body of Christ and there is no such thing as a member who does not share in the mission of the Body, and in the priesthood of Christ. When we learn to follow God's call to us, the result is joy and fulfilment, whether that vocation is an overtly religious one or not. We are asked this weekend in Ballincollig Parish to reflect on our vocation, on God's personal call to each of us to a particular life.

The idea of letting a call from God (!) determine our way of life is an incomprehensible notion to many of our contemporaries, in contrast to prevailing individualistic value systems. This is especially the case in relation to a religious vocation, which involves a commitment to celibacy, which seems to make no sense at all. And yet in spite of sceptical attitudes, in spite of the decline in priestly and religious vocations, people still follow faithfully and joyfully their religious or lay vocations, enriching their own lives and the life of the Church community to which they belong.

The men and women who are members of religious orders, congregations and societies spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ through a variety of ways including lives of contemplative prayer, education, medicine, social work, development work, counselling, pastoral care, media, ecology, art and culture, farming etc. They work in Ireland and also all over the world. Whatever you want to do in your life you can do as a religious Sister, Brother or Priest. Vocations to the religious life are extremely varied and all can lead to joy and fulfilment.

The ordained priest is to be a fellow disciple and a brother among brothers and sisters in the family of God and at the same time pastor and teacher. The first task of priesthood is to announce the Gospel of Christ. Priests are available to all people, discussing problems and listening to them, fostering maturity and encouraging those whom they advise to live not only for themselves, but also for others. Celibacy in the priesthood is a prophetic sign of the world to come, in which people shall neither marry or be given in marriage. We accept celibacy as a gift, and indeed celibacy cannot be successfully and healthily lived without such an attitude. Priests are called to be apart from the world but not separate from it, the priest's pastoral love for the people whom he serves is derived principally from the Eucharist, the centre and source of his life.

The vocation to a married or single lay life is the norm, and such vocations are the mainstay of the Church. The teaching of the Church in the second Vatican Council recognises the dignity of such vocations and provides that lay people should be encouraged to undertake duties within the Church, and to take initiatives and develop projects of their own (Vatican II, Presbyterorum Ordinis).

The Lord has a plan for each of us; he calls each one of us by name. We are called to witness, to love and to serve, vocations for all of us are about following Christ. A generous response to a vocation is a source of happiness and joy, giving of ourselves we realise and experience that "it is in giving that we receive.".

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Exodus 22:20-28

God calls for sensitivity for the needs of others. A social morality is demanded. It singles out those for whom God has a special love, as should God's chosen people; a love for the stranger, widow, orphan, poor. Often these do not enjoy full civil rights and are victims of oppression and exploitation. Members of a truly just society must be compassionate and provide for its weakest members.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

Paul is fulsome in his praise for the Christian community of the Thessalonians. He had come to them with the Good News. With the power of the Spirit and in spite of much suffering they received his teaching with open minds and generous hearts. Their way of life radically changed. They were now an example of the life of love to other Christian communities.

Gospel: Matthew 22:34-40

Trying to trick Jesus into saying something contrary to Moses, the Pharisees asked Jesus which was the greatest commandment. Jesus responded by saying that we are to love God with all our heart, our soul, and mind. Secondly, we are to love our neighbour as our self.


Parish Office
