Since our pastoral plan called Pilgrim Steps was launched in 2005, parishes have been setting up and consolidating their pastoral councils, parish assemblies and parish finance committees. I thank all those involved in this work and I know that it will bear much fruit.

I now think it is necessary to move on to the next stage, as proposed in that document - the creation of pastoral areas. This is a process whereby neighbouring parishes plan and work together in a way that is truly co-operative.

Moving towards co-operation and sharing of resources between parishes is all the more imperative as the number of priests decreases. The scarcity of priests is taking hold and we have to respond to it in practical ways.

Last year, I established a working group to assist me in developing further the concept of pastoral areas. Solutions to many of the questions need to be found by all of us working together and sharing our gifts and talents. It is my hope that during this year we can make significant progress in developing pastoral areas in the diocese.

I am convening an initial meeting for clergy, religious and parish representatives which will take place on Sunday March 9th, 2008 in Cork. At this meeting, we will outline and discuss the first steps involved in setting up pastoral areas in the diocese, in other words, in helping each parish to plan and work more closely with its neighbours.

It is my aim to keep everyone informed of developments as we progress in this important work. Please keep this work in your prayers..

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 8:23 - 9:3

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. Those who lived in the land of gloom now have joy, for the yoke that burdened them God has smashed.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

Paul wrote to the people of Corinth: let "there be no divisions among you,... be united in mind and in the same purpose." I have heard "that there are rivalries among you.... Is Christ divided?"

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

The reading today from Matthew's Gospel takes place early in Jesus' ministry. Several ideas are clear. First of all, Matthew strived to connect his Gospel for the early Christians to their Jewish heritage. He made several references in his Gospel like the one today in which prophecies of old are fulfilled in Jesus. The second thing was that Jesus learned of John the Baptist's arrest and resolved to begin his ministry away from Herod. Finally, Jesus called with some urgency, his first four disciples. The common thread to all this was that God's Kingdom was at hand.

Effective from Saturday 2nd February the Vigil Mass at Christ Our Light changes from 8 pm to 7.30 pm. This Mass time change has been approved by Bishop John Buckley following adoption of the proposal by the Parish Council and the views of parishioners who attend this Mass.

This Week's Calendar

Monday 28 – St Thomas Aquinas, priest and doctor of the Church (1224-1274). Thomas taught that Christian revelation and human knowledge are aspects of a single truth and cannot be in conflict with one another. One of the greatest theologians, he is patron of schools, universities, students and booksellers.

Tuesday 29 – Weekday (3rd in Ordinary Time).

Wednesday 30 – St Aidan, bishop. A native of Cavan, Aidan studied under St David of Wales before returning to his native Ireland to set up a monastery at Ferns in Wexford. His fame spread as a pastor and preacher. He died in 626.

Thursday 31 – St John Bosco, priest (1815-1888). Born in Italy into poverty, he devoted his life to the education of the poor, especially the young. He founded two religious congregations to continue his work – the Salesians and the Helpers of Mary. He is patron of the youth and Catholic publishers.

Friday, 1 February – St Brigid, Secondary Patron of Ireland. She founded a monastery at Kildare and is renowned for her generosity and care of the sick. She died in 524. She is known as Mary of the Gael.

Saturday, 2 February – The Presentation of the Lord. This feast is 'a combined remembrance of the Son and the mother.' It is a festival of light, honouring Christ, the light of the world. It is also celebrated as a Day for Consecrated Life.


