Pentecost Sunday

The first coming of the Holy Spirit on the Church was wind and fire and the telling of God's wonderful deeds in many tongues. The Spirit also comes as many gifts for the common good, bringing peace along with God's forgiving

power.

Things that go bump at Mass

Mobiles phones ringing, babies wailing, children running about gleefully whilst eating crisps; adults chewing gum and many different conversations being held at once. Sounds like a children's party or perhaps the flavour of a pub on a Sunday afternoon? Wrong. This is what happens in church, at mass, in our parish!! Mercifully not all the time, but often enough to bring forth the angst and ire and sincere upset of those who come to pray! (Yeah, the Lord's house is one of prayer, not a market place). Maybe this is a timely reminder for all of us on behaviour in church. We live in an increasingly casual society, where many formalities are dispensed with. However participation in church services demands a certain decorum.

Out of courtesy and respect to God and others, phones should be switched off. It is not safe to allow children run around unsupervised. There are many dangers; from microphone wires to feeble elderly adults who could easily be tripped. Christ Our Light church has a designated Crying Room for restless babies, as well as 2 other rooms off the church that can also be used for the same purpose. Whilst your child may be your delight and joy, and your familiarity with their cries and tantrums may be music to your ears, think of how others experience this? It can be extremely disruptive. Apart from showing disrespect to those who have to come to worship, let's not forget either how it can unsettle the Lector who is trying their best to concentrate on proclaiming the Word of God. Other liturgical ministers (cantors, the priest etc) should not have to raise their voices to compete with extraneous voices from the congregation.

Remember a little hush when entering Gods house is appropriate. The worship space deserves to be treated with dignity and reverence as a sign of our respect for God's presence in this holy place. Apart from being aware of the need for quiet (Biblically it is always in the stillness and quietness that God's voice is heard), we need to be aware of how we leave the environment after our visit. The misalettes, this publication and other materials need to be collected up, taken home for recycling or put in the appropriate bin. Nobody can justify leaving papers scattered on the pews or on the floor of the house of God. You wouldn't leave another person's home in a mess after a visit would you? Remember people coming to a later mass would like to find the church in a presentable fashion conducive to prayer.

Full participation in the liturgy requires that the gathering responds to the prayers with a firm AMEN, where required or an ALSO WITH YOU as other responses indicate. There are also other communally recited prayersl: The Penitential Rite, Gloria, Response to Psalm, Creed, Responses to Petitions, Acclamation of Faith, Our Father and Lamb of God. The misalettes contain the prescribed words if you are unsure of the text. If there is singing, please join in as singing is like doubly raising your heart to God in prayer.

Posture is used in the liturgy as both a gesture of respect and as a rubric of communal worship. We stand during the gospel for example as a sign of our reverence for the Word of God. It breaks the flow of the liturgy if the priest has to ask you to stand! Surely everyone knows that you stand for the gospel (unless physically impaired) as it has always been this way! Equally the local custom is sit for the homily and stand again for the creed and to kneel for the Eucharistic prayer.

Receiving Eucharist needs to be done with dignity. It is not a rugby scrum! Take your time. Proceed in an orderly fashion to the Eucharistic Minister and stop to take the host and consume it before turning back. I have seen people grabbing the sacred host and make a 180 degree turn from the altar with as much gracefulness as a tractor, bumping into those behind in the line. There are many folk who belong to the fast food brigade, and literally treat Communion as a take out. Grab and go is the philosophy. If there is a compelling reason why you must leave church early, please do so, but in a manner which is noble.

Hopefully this gentle reminder of how we need to be aware of our actions at mass won't cause offence to anybody, but that you will take it in the spirit of which it is intended: to make the worship experience a more enriching one for all who participate.

Reflection for Parents

Our children often come to us frightened about one thing or another. It is our job to calm their fears and generally we do a pretty good job. But sometimes, our doubts or concerns are the same as theirs. When this happens, we're not always sure how to answer them and after reading today's Gospel we may think that our faith is not strong enough. But doubt does not necessarily mean a lack of faith. Sometimes the best thing we can do is tell our children we wonder about the same things they do and then together think about how our faith helps us answer the concern. Generally, these conversations revolve around a serious illness or death in the family and what happens when we die. It's not "lack of faith" that causes us to not know. It is a "lack of knowledge," because it's true, none of us knows exactly.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts: 2:1-11

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Second Reading: Rom. 8:8-17

We are always faced with the choice between following our nobler or our meaner instincts in the conduct of our day-to-day lives. Paul calls this living according to the Spirit or living according to the flesh - and then he suggests that the most vital, life-giving choice we can make is to let the Holy Spirit be our guiding light.

Gospel: John 14:15-16, 23-26

If we obey god's commandments then we will be given the Holy Spirit and he will abide in us for ever. Jesus was saying that the Holy Spirit will be in us forever if we continue to obey god's commandments for our lifetime. God always travels with his people. We pray today for a new outpouring, come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of our faithful.


