Following God's Word

Martin Niemoeller was a Luthern Pastor in Germany before the Second World War. Because of his words from the pulpit, he came to the attention of the Gestapo, the secret police. Eventually, he was arrested and sent to a concentration camp.

After that happened, Martin's father, also a Pastor, came out of retirement and took over his son's ministry. He was asked one day to describe his feelings about his son's arrest and internment. He replied "Yes, it is a terrible thing to have to bear, to have a son in such danger."

"However, it would have been much more terrible, if God had called upon Martin to be His witness and for him to refuse, take the easy way and co-operate with the Nazis. So, I am glad he spoke out, proud to have a son who acted the way Jesus would have done. The way that Jesus did act in Palestine all those years ago."

We have had a glimpse on this earth of the truth of God's Kingdom. We have heard the gospel stories of Jesus, and we have the teachings of the Church over 2,000 years. Yet we know that the wonder of God is way beyond our understanding. Jesus came to us and showed the way of our Father. It may not be easy for us to live up to, but we do understand what Jesus taught. The challenge for us is to live God's way, to follow God's word.

Anyone who wants to become a London taxi-driver must pass a test about how to drive around the streets of the Capital. "The Knowledge" is gained by learning the routes through 30,000 miles of streets, and being able to respond to a passenger's request. The examiner may ask anything, any possible journey, and the trainee has only one year in which to learn it all.

Knowing the message of God, as told by Jesus and His appointees, is more straight-forward than learning all the streets of London. However, to follow the Word of God takes most of us a lifetime. Then we still have difficulty in getting it right.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 1: 1-11

St. Luke, the writer of the Gospel was also the author of The Acts of the Apostles. At the beginning of this book he refers to the Gospel as "his earlier work". He fills in the events between the Resurrection and the Ascension. The Apostles are given their last commandments: to preach to the whole world. They are reminded that the Second Coming will only happen after the Gospel has been preached to the whole world.

Second Reading: Ephesians 4: 1-13

In the list of gifts given to the church the point he makes is that their aim is to enlarge the unity of the Church, and to develop its intensity until we all attain full unity with the Son of God. The unity of the Church is stressed. But that unity does not mean uniformity as the gifts differ in each person.

Gospel: Mark 16: 15-20

The Apostles are commanded to preach the Gospel to all. The salvation which it brings is for all without exception. In the early days of the Church, possibly because of a greater need for extraordinary signs to move a sceptical and hostile world miracles were more frequent than in later times.


Lost Tan Purse
