Feasts of All Saints & All Souls

November is an important month in the calendar of the Church. The feasts of All Saints and All Souls are celebrated on the first days of November allowing us to dwell on important aspects of life and faith. These feasts give us an opportunity to pray and reflect on our origin, purpose and destiny. The Church has never been afraid to exhort us to examine the sober, some would say the bitter side of life and faith -death, judgement and the second coming. The readings during the coming Sundays and weekdays invite us to reflect on the last things so that we learn, in ever deeper measure that with the Lord a day is like a thousand years and a thousand years is like a day.

The Church recommends that we visit a graveyard during the first week of November. The recommendation fuses well with the celebration of the feast of All Saints. Among our graves are those who are in that company. They are people - relatives, friends and neighbours - who enfleshed the values of the beatitudes in the life they lived. To be gentle, to mourn, to hunger for justice, to be merciful are signs of the Kingdom of God in our lives. They did the ordinary things very well. Many of the people we remember during November shaped our lives by their love.

They did not see themselves as potential saints but we recognise that they are tilted in that direction. During the month of November we remember those who travelled before us. They have gone many routes; as parents, widows or orphans, nurse or teacher, as rich or poor person and some heroes have gone the road of suffering. Their lives inspire us. Joan Chittister reminds us, "saints are people like ourselves, reachable figures who have lived well through situations similar to our own as proof that we too, in all our smallness, can stretch ourselves to the limits of the best in us".

All Souls Day

Is a day of remembrance for friends and loved ones who have passed away. This comes from the ancient Pagan Festival of the Dead, which celebrated the Pagan belief that the souls of the dead would return for a meal with the family. Candles in the window would guide the souls back home, and another place was set at the table. Children would come through the village, asking for food to be offered symbolically to the dead, then donated to feed the hungry. The day purposely follows All Saint's Day in order to shift the focus from those in heaven to those in purgatory. It is celebrated with masses and festivities in honour of the dead. While the Feast of All Saints is a day to remember the glories of Heaven and those there, the Feast of All Souls reminds us of our obligations to live holy lives and that there will be purification of the souls of those destined for Heaven.
