'Lord That I May See'

In our first reading, the Prophet Jeremiah speaks of a loving God who wants to gather his loyal and faithful people, exiled in Babylon, and bring them back to their homeland. Though the people of Israel had 'left in tears', scattered by warfare and exile, for the trials of life in a foreign land, the Lord promises to comfort and guide them as he leads them home. God especially favours the most needy. The prophet assures them they can look forward to a future filled with blessings for the Lord has saved them.

We see in the Gospel, when the blind beggar Bartimaeus hears that Jesus is approaching, he cries out a prayer of petition 'Son of David, Jesus have pity on me'. Some of those following Jesus resent this disturbance so they tell him to keep quiet. But it does not stop his persistence in calling out for healing from Jesus. Jesus hears him and he asks the crowd to bring this man to him. They too have a change of heart, for they bring Bartimaeus to him saying: 'Courage,' 'get up; he is calling you.' Then Jesus asks him, 'What do you want me to do for you?' This was the moment of hope for the blind man. Bartimaeus gives Jesus a very simple answer expressing his faith and trust in God: "Lord, that I may see." Jesus heals him. Once the blind man receives his sight he responds by becoming a disciple of Jesus.

Today, what would my response be to Jesus' question: 'what do you want me to do for you?'

We remember the many people suffering in our world today who feel helpless and live in darkness for one reason or another.

On Thursday next we celebrate the Feast of All Saints, both the canonised and the uncanonised. In St John's vision of heaven, (Book of the Apocalypse), he sees: "a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language standing before the Throne of God". In the First Letter of St John, he reminds us of the great love of God who already has chosen to call us His children. "What we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed, we will be like Him, because we will see him as he is." Even though all those who have gone before us were sinners and experienced trials and temptations like ourselves, yet their faith, hope and love sustained them on their pilgrim journey. They are now enjoying the glory and happiness of being face to face with God.

Today's gospel the restoring of his sight to the blind beggar. His sight is restored to Bartimaeus but just as important he becomes the symbol of "those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death " Bartimaeus expresses his conviction by his repeated cries, by his leap of faith which makes him reject every support and takes him towards the one who calls him and is going to heal him No sooner is he cured than Bartimaeus gets ready to follow Jesus on the way, his cure leads him to conversion and type of model disciple.

Weekly Contribution - Tax Rebate

Helping Ballincollig parish financially without dipping into your pocket. Weekly many people contribute at least five euro to the offertory collection. This contribution could be enhanced by claiming from the Dept of Finance the income tax paid by the donor on five euro a week. This tax rebate (can be claimed by organisations with charitable status which Ballincollig parish has,) would amount to at least €40 per eligible donor. I need your help to implement this scheme.

The dept of finance will need a record to be kept locally verifying the contributions. The simplest method to implement this is, for parishioners to voluntarily record their contribution. To make this possible I intend to supply boxes of envelopes with a number; invite parishioners to record the no on their box with me and then on a weekly basis note the no and amount.
