Jesus the Teacher

This Sunday, 30th January 2005 is chosen as Catechetical Sunday. It is an opportunity to celebrate and encourage those who work hard to help all people both young and old, to grow in faith. This includes parents, teachers, catechists and school chaplains as well as others members of our faith community. It is also a time to focus on the centre of any Christian education, the words, works and person of Jesus.

The theme for Catechetical Sunday 2005 is 'Jesus the Teacher', and highlights our greatest source of inspiration and guidance for handing on the faith to our children and developing our faith in our own lives. The gospel on this Sunday is Jesus' most famous and best-known sermon, the part of the Sermon on the Mount known as the Beatitudes. This is the source of what will echo through so much of our teaching and ministry that we are blessed in all of life in the care of our loving Father. Can this teaching be as powerful in our lives as Jesus would wish it to be?

Catechetical Sunday draws our attention to those who dedicate time and their lives to handing on the Faith. On looking around us in Family, school and parish we find inspirational people who have helped us receive and deepen the gift of faith in our lives. It is also an opportunity to recognise that as members of the church we are all teachers with Jesus, if we can communicate the joy and fulfilment of Jesus Christ found in our own relationship with him. People with a living faith pass on a living faith, and only those who meet Jesus regularly in prayer and in the Eucharist can hand on a living knowledge of Jesus alive. There are some posters in the church today depicting the Beatitudes. The posters were prepared by pupils in fifth class in the primary schools of the parish, a reminder to us of the dedicated work teachers do day after day in schools in handing on the faith.

### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13 "Seek the Lord, all you humble of the earth," said Zephaniah the prophet. Do what is right. "Seek justice." Those who take refuge in the Lord shall pasture their flocks.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:26-31 The weak of the world are chosen by God. "Whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord."

### Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12

The beatitudes are the content of this Gospel and they begin what we commonly call, "The Sermon on the Mount." Jesus' words surely turned upside down the understanding his listeners had of the world and society. Jesus told them that the poor would be rich, the hungry would be filled, and the persecuted would be rewarded. In all, there are eight statements that give the people a new understanding of Moses' law and a clearer image of God's Kingdom.

### SAINT OF THE WEEK

#### St Blaise 03-February-2005

According to legend St. Blaise was a physician at Sebaste, Armenia, before he became the Bishop of that See. Accounts of his life place his martyrdom in the year 316. At the time of the persecution he was taken prisoner at the command of the Governor, Agricolaus. The hunters of the Governor found him in the wilderness in a cave to which he had retired. While in prison he performed a wonderful cure on a boy who had a fishbone in his throat and who was in danger of choking to death. After suffering various forms of torture, St. Blaise was beheaded.

The veneration of the saint was brought into Western Europe at an early date and he became one of the most popular saints of the Middle Ages. On the day of his feast a special blessing is given: two candles are held in a crossed position beneath the throat of the recipient and a special prayer for protection against diseases of the throat is said.


