Sometimes this leads to everybody losing out.

The unless syndrome often strengthens with age and becomes an attitude that permeates family relationships under the pretext of protecting future harmony." I will not unless you.. "can sound so reasonable but it usually displays an inability or unwillingness to trust another.. Often this view can be justified but in other situations the" unless" approach is no substitute for trust.

Today's gospel has the story of one such situation. Having missed the visit of the Risen Lord, Thomas rants that he will not believe unless certain conditions are met. In his great love the Risen Lord meets these conditions to enable the doubting Thomas to believe. But more is promised to those who believe and trust unconditionally, who trust God and others..

To be able to trust is a marvellous gift to be prayed for constantly. To be willing to trust is a decision that one can choose to make or not. Our decisions gradually make us what we become. Only the Holy Spirit can ensure that the "unless" syndrome does not wreck our relationships with one another and with God..

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 2:42-47

Early Christians adhered to apostolic teaching, centering their lives on prayer, the breaking of the bread, the common life, and charity.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

Through God's great mercy, Christians have new life in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The goal of faith is salvation.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Following Jesus' crucifixion the disciples were still uncertain of his message. They lost hope and in fear locked themselves in a room. Without entering through the door, Jesus appeared before them with a greeting of peace and a mission to spread the Good News. The disciple, Thomas, was not in the room. When he learned of Jesus' visit, he would not believe it. But about week later, Jesus appeared in a similar way when Thomas was with the others. Jesus invited Thomas to touch the wounds in his hands and side. Thomas knew immediately that it was Jesus and believed in him.

Today is the anniversary of the death of Pope John Paul II (2005). Thursday 3 – Easter Weekday


Friday 4 - St Isidore, bishop and doctor of the Church. Isidore became bishop of Seville in the year 600 and died there in 636.
