### **The Feast Of The Holy Trinity**

“Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, the God who is, who was, and who is to come.”

As a priest I have often found myself in a variety of different places celebrating the Mass and praying with fellow members of God’s family. The sense of one Church, one faith, sometimes comes home to me when it comes to professing our faith in the Creed.

As Christians no matter where any of us finds ourselves we are all called to serve God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Many people might believe in God or ponder on whether or not God exists or indeed accept a God of one or two or more dimensions. We as Christians on the other hand are quite unique because we align ourselves to a God as revealed in the Trinity of Father, Son, and Spirit. Our regular efforts to offer a prayer is accompanied with the sign of the Cross in the name of the Trinity. The feast of the Trinity reminds us of the simple prayer of “Glory be to our God...” and allows us to look at how profound are the ways God has chosen to reveal Himself to us and to the world. Our triune God, my dear friends, comes in search of us and wishes to manifest Himself to us and reveal His love, His power, His glory. The revelation by God to the world as Father, Son and Spirit united in each other is a revelation of God seeking to bring love, compassion, companionship, healing, understanding into the world in which we live and into the lives we lead. In a relationship with the God of the Trinity the journey of life becomes more of a partnership than a lone voyage. “And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.”

Perhaps in your moments of prayer despite the difficulties of life, in moments when you give thanks, you and I are showing real commitment to our baptism and to a God so readily giving Himself to us. In all places and in all time let us search for ways to seek to glorify our triune God, Father, Son & Spirit.

**Experiencing Grief and Loss**

When grieving the death of loved ones, 'Acceptance' is the phase which happens gradually. When we talk about 'letting go' and 'acceptance/moving on', it does not mean forgetting - it is more a 'letting go' of life as it was before the death of your loved one. Most people who have had someone close to them die say that they never fully get over it. But they find a way to cope and adjust to daily life without their loved one; while continuing to honour their memory. They begin to enjoy things in their life again. Hearing this can sometimes be a relief to people who are going through the stormier stages of grief. You will from time to time have your 'trigger' moments; e.g. the first Christmas, Birthday, significant anniversaries. Avoidance of facing one's feelings and emotions may slow the healing. Like the earlier parts of the grieving process, 'acceptance' does not happen overnight. Everyone reaches this point at different times. It's important to know that there are no time limits and no rushing the process. We will never forget our loved ones - they continue to live on in us by the example of their lives. May the Lord comfort and console all who are grieving the loss of loved ones and give you the strength and courage to look to the future with hope.
