The Ascension of Jesus

After his Resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples many times. Knowing that in a short while he would no longer be physically present with them, he was preparing them to continue his Mission. Before ascending to Heaven Jesus promised them that when He left, He would send them the Holy Spirit, saying: You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; then you will be My witnesses in all Judea and Samaria and from one end of the earth to the other."

Jesus continues to be very much present in our lives today. He is present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. He is present in the Word that is spoken to us from the Scriptures. He is present in each person we encounter. In today's second reading we pray, in the words of St Paul, that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, will also give us a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring us to full knowledge of him. We are being challenged today to look around us and see in what ways we can continue to be the presence of Christ for others. We together, as a Christian community, make up the Body of Christ and as the prayer of St Teresa reminds us: "Christ has no body now but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good, Yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, Yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now but yours."

On this 'Communication Sunday', this extract is from a Message given by Pope Francis: "As sons and daughters of God, we are called to communicate with everyone without exception. In a particular way, the Church's words and actions are all meant to convey mercy. Communication has the power to build bridges, to enable encounter and inclusion, and thus to enrich society. For this reason, I would like to invite all people of good will to rediscover the power of mercy to heal wounded relationships and to restore peace and harmony to families and communities (Pope Francis)."

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 1:1-11

At the very beginning of the Acts of the Apostles we are told of the promise of the Holy Spirit. Then follows an account of the Ascension of Jesus, his departure in a physical sense, from this world. But this is a guarantee of his presence powerfully with us by his Spirit.

Second Reading: Eph 1:17-23

This reading, which is a series of prayerful intercessions, is also addressed to the early Christians. It is clear that union with Christ is what sets Christians apart. The body metaphor characterising the Church is introduced at the end of the reading. As members of this body, believers share in Christ's fullness and are called to live lives informed by their relationship with Christ.

Gospel: Luke 24:46-53

In today's gospel, Luke depicts Jesus as delivering one last instruction to his disciples before he ascends into heaven. They are to proclaim to all the nations that Jesus did indeed die and rise again after preaching a radically new message, and they in turn have to bring this new message to the world.


