## The Body and Blood of Christ


### Corpus Christi

### Corpus Christi

 During this week-end there will be Eucharistic Processions, not only here at Ballincollig but throughout Ireland and the rest of the world. As members of the Body of Christ we are giving witness to our faith and demonstrating our reverence and gratitude for the Blessed Sacrament. So often in the Gospels we see Jesus walking with people, feeding, healing and nourishing them. Jesus continues to reveal himself to us when we hear and see others witness to their faith. In celebrating this feast of Corpus Christi we proclaim our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. As we accompany Him through our Streets this weekend, we are reminded that as baptised Christians he lives within each one of us; and so we are challenged to be the body of Christ in our world today.

The feast of Corpus Christi is also a celebration of the generosity and hospitality of Jesus. In today's Gospel we see how the people were drawn to Him. He made the crowds welcome and spoke to them about the Kingdom of God. He also cured those who were in need of healing. However, we also see that as night draws on the Apostles want to send the crowd away, so they can get something to eat. Jesus tells them: "you give them something to eat". Their response was to talk about their lack of resources for such a large crowd, but Jesus ignores them and tells them to get the crowds to sit down in groups. Then we see the generosity of Jesus: "who took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, blessed them and broke them and gave to the disciples to place before the crowd". And "they all ate and the surplus taken up, filled twelve baskets of fragments". God's love and generosity shows his compassion for all who are in need. This is a challenging Gospel when we think of all those around us and in our world who are in need in so many ways today. Jesus cares for the whole person, by responding to both their physical and spiritual needs.

**THE SUNDAY READINGS**

First Reading: Gen 14:18-20

The story of Melchisedech, priest who offers bread and wine and receives God's blessing, is often understood as a foreshadowing of the Eucharist, which we celebrate.

Second Reading: 1 Cor 11:23-26

This is St Paul's account of Eucharistic celebration in the early Church.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17.

Jesus continued to teach the crowds that had gathered until late in the day when his disciples came to him and said that Jesus should let the crowd go so that they might find food and a place to stay. Jesus told the disciples to feed the crowd themselves, but they knew it would be impossible because they only had five loaves of bread and two fish among them. Jesus instructed the disciples to divide the people into groups of fifty. Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, blessed and broke them and shared them among the people. Not only was this food sufficient for the crowd but they had twelve baskets of leftovers.
