THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5
 The Prophet Isaiah speaks of a time when all the nations will hear the Word of God and be united.

Second Reading: Romans 13:11-14
 St. Paul issues a wake-up call for this Advent season.

Gospel: Matthew 24:37-40, 44.
 The emphasis of today's Gospel is on the second coming of Jesus. Matthew refers to three events that show we do not know when Jesus will return, but the message is clear: we are to be ready! The first reference Matthew makes is to Noah and the flood. People were occupied with their daily lives / eating, drinking, and marrying. In the second example, men were working in the field and women were grinding at the mill. Some were taken and some remained. In the final example, the master of the house could have prevented the robbery if only he had known when the thief would come. This Gospel is a stern caution for each of us to live in preparation for Jesus' return.

Managing Stress

Stress is a negative state which commonly involves anxiety, fear and agitation. It happens when demand is being placed on a person that is not easily met.

Many areas of our daily lives cause us to feel varying degrees of pressure. When that pressure has a negative effect on physical or mental health it has become stress. Common stressors include money worries, career issues, relationship conflicts and major life changes.

Symptoms of stress may include increased heartbeat, upset stomach, sweaty palms, change in appetite or disrupted sleep patterns.

Learning how to recognise the sources of stress in your life is the first step in managing them. Coping mechanisms may include adopting more healthy lifestyle habits such as eating a more well balanced diet, taking regular exercise and getting enough sleep. Practicing relaxation techniques such as meditation or yoga may also help relieve stress.
