Doubting Thomas

Thomas seems to have been overwhelmed by grief and from Good Friday he had gone his separate way. Thomas was in deep grief and very often when we are grieving we tend to isolate ourselves. Isolating oneself is understandable but is not very helpful. Thomas it seems was cut off from the other disciples and this made life more difficult for him. However his little contact would have helped him to notice the change in mood of the others, he may even have heard about the empty tomb.

Some of his companions had claimed they saw Jesus, Thomas needed more than words (once bitten twice shy) Thomas wanted to be sure. He is echoing the human condition for certainty. Here on earth there is no such thing as certainty about spiritual matters. We depend on faith. Thomas had renewed contact with the community and this helped him to discover faith again. Here with the community he met the risen Christ and came to faith.

Being a believer today can be lonely. It is with the help of community that we can resolve our doubts and sustain our faith. We see the kind of community the early Christians enjoyed. They supported one another, prayed and worshipped together. They also gave material support to those in need. They listened and learnt from one another.

Early Christians adhered to apostolic teaching, centering their lives on prayer, the breaking of the bread, the common life, and charity.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:3-9

Through God's great mercy, Christians have new life in the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The goal of faith is salvation.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Following Jesus' crucifixion the disciples were still uncertain of his message. They lost hope and in fear locked themselves in a room. Without entering through the door, Jesus appeared before them with a greeting of peace and a mission to spread the Good News. The disciple, Thomas, was not in the room. When he learned of Jesus' visit, he would not believe it. But about week later, Jesus appeared in a similar way when Thomas was with the others. Jesus invited Thomas to touch the wounds in his hands and side. Thomas knew immediately that it was Jesus and believed in him.
